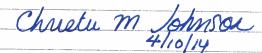

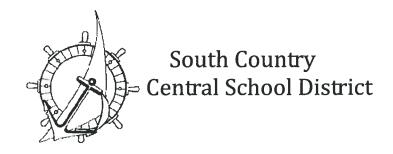

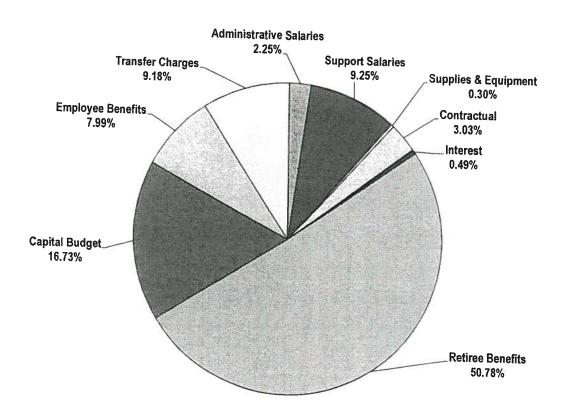
The Administrative Budget is comprised of two pieces, Administrative Expenses and Capital Expenses.

The Capital Budget is comprised primarily of rental of facilities and an appropriation for an interfund transfer to the Capital fund.

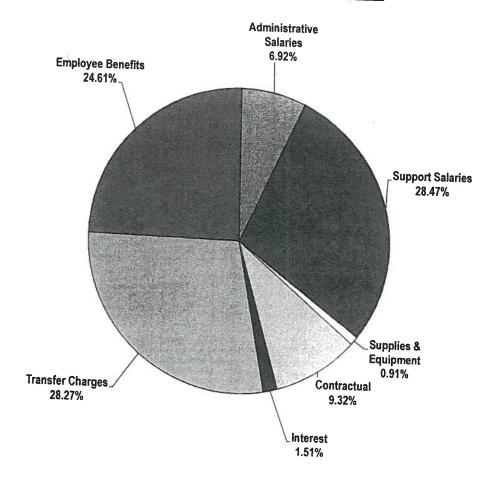
EASTERN SUFFOLK BOCES 2014-15 Administrative, Retiree & Capital Budget



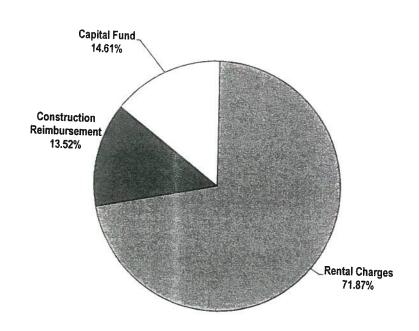
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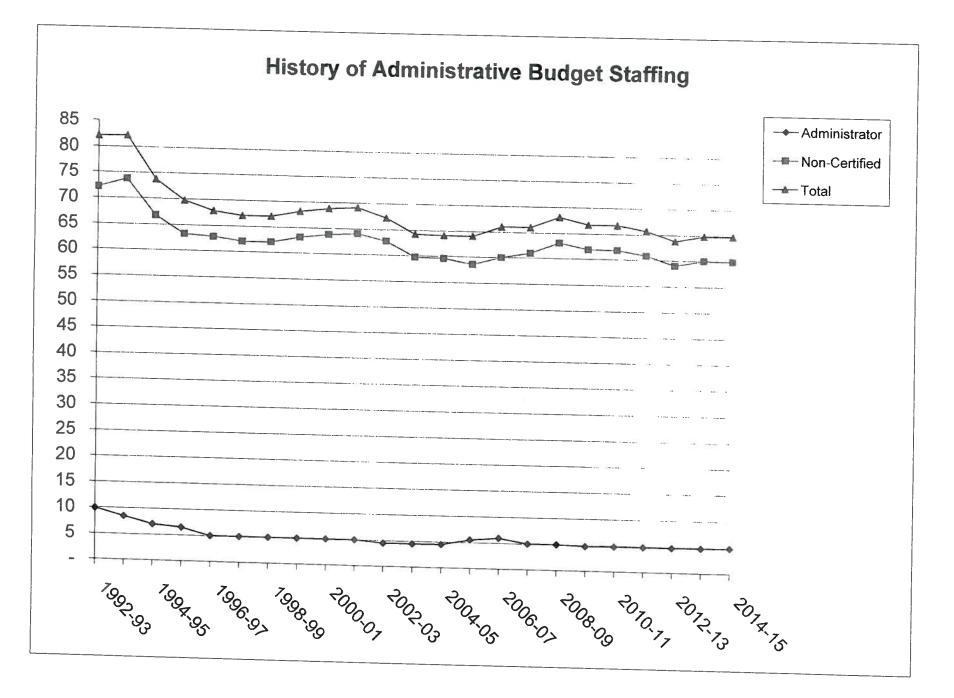
EASTERN SUFFOLK BOCES 2014-15 Administrative Operating & Capital Budgets

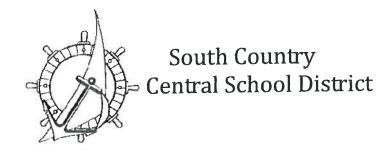

HEALTH AND WELFARE SERVICE AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is made this _____ day of _____, 2014, by and between the BOARD OF EDUCATION, SACHEM CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT (hereinafter referred to as the "SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES"), as the party of the first part, having its principal place of business at 51 SCHOOL STREET, LAKE RONKONKOMA, NY 11779, and the BOARD OF EDUCATION, SOUTH COUNTRY CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT ("hereinafter referred to as the "SCHOOL DISTRICT RECEIVING SERVICES") as the party of the second part, having its principal place of business at 189 DUNTON AVENUE, EAST PATCHOGUE, NY 11772.

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the School Districts who are the parties to this Agreement are duly empowered by Section 912 of the Education Law to enter into a contract for the purpose of providing and/or receiving health and welfare services;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants contained in this Agreement, the parties hereto mutually agree as follows:

1. DEFINITIONS: For the purposes of this Agreement,

, , , , ,

- a. "SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES" shall mean the School District in which the nonpublic school which has requested health and welfare services is located.
- b. "SCHOOL DISTRICT RECEIVING SERVICES" shall mean the School District that is contracting for health and welfare services for its resident students who attend a nonpublic school located within the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES.
- 2. This Agreement shall take effect on the 1st day of September 2013, for the period of September 3, 2013 through June 26, 2014, and terminate on June 30, 2014, unless terminated earlier in accordance with the terms set forth herein.
- 3. If requested by a nonpublic school located within the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES, such School District shall provide health and welfare services to the pupils who attend such non-public school equivalent to the health and welfare services that it provides to the public school pupils enrolled in the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES. Such services shall consist of, but not limited to the following:

a. Nurse Services

- b. Physician/Dental Services
- c. School Speech Correction Services*
- d. School Psychological Services*
- e. School Social Work Services
- f. Examinations for Participants in Athletics
- g. Notification of Parents Regarding Defect and Follow-Up
- h. Visions and Hearing Tests
- i. First Aid Supplies and Health Record Forms
- j. Provision of Medical Equipment such as Audiometers and Mechanical Vision Testers Required by School Nurse/Physician

The services set forth above may be rendered on nonpublic school premises except for school psychological and speech correction services as further described below.

* School psychological and speech correction services may be rendered on nonpublic school premises only to the extent that such services are *diagnostic* in nature. To the extent that such services are therapeutic or remedial in nature, they may be rendered to a student attending a nonpublic school *only on a religiously neutral site*. A religiously neutral site may be, but is not limited to, a public school, a mobile unit or some other public location.

In addition to the requested services described above, the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES shall provide the following health and welfare services without the requirement that the non-public school request such services: (1) immunization mandates set forth in Sections 2164 and 2165 of the New York State Public Health Law and 10 NYCRR Sections 66-1 and 66-2; and (2) vision screening services to all new admissions within six (6) months of enrollment pursuant to Section 905(4) of the Education Law.

The SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES shall make its personnel available to the SCHOOL DISTRICT RECEIVING SERVICES for participation in District Child Study, 504 Team and Committee on Special Education meetings, as appropriate. The SCHOOL DISTRICT RECEIVING SERVICES shall notify the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES of the need for its presence at these meetings within reasonable time prior to the date of the meeting. Copies of all reports, testing and observation reports prepared in connection with this Agreement shall be furnished to the SCHOOL DISTRICT RECEIVING SERVICES upon request.

It is expressly understood and agreed between the parties that (1) the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES may not provide such services to pupils attending nonpublic schools that are not available to the public school students enrolled in the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES; and (2) the services to be provided pursuant to this Agreement shall not include any teaching service.

- 4. The SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES warrants that such health care services (1) will be provided by licensed health and welfare providers; (2) shall be performed by health care providers that are licensed under the laws of the State of New York, inclusive of New York State Department of Health and State Education Department Licensing requirements, if applicable; and (3) will be in accord with all pertinent provisions of Federal, State, and local statutes, rules, and regulations, including, Section 912 of the Education Law, and the student's Individualized Education Plan ("IEP"), if applicable. The SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES shall certify that all health care providers possess documentation evidencing such license qualifications as required by Federal, State, or local statutes, rules, regulations and orders.
- 5. The SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES understands and agrees that it will comply and is responsible for complying with all applicable Federal, State, and local statutes, rules and ordinances, with respect to the services herein described.
- 6. In full consideration for the services to be rendered by the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES to the SCHOOL DISTRICT RECEIVING SERVICES for the period of this Agreement, upon presentation of an invoice by the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES evidencing the allocation of such costs in accordance with the terms set forth herein, the SCHOOL DISTRICT RECEIVING SERVICES will pay the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES at the rate of \$ 941.94 per student for the period of September 2013 through June 2014.
- 7. THE SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES shall immediately notify the SCHOOL DISTRICT RECEIVING SERVICES if a student is no longer receiving the services described herein. Upon such notification, payment for students removed shall be pro-rated for the period of time services were provided to the student.
- 8. The SCHOOL DISTRICT RECEIVING SERVICES shall obtain whatever releases or other legal documents that are necessary in order that the SCHOOL

DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES may render full and complete performance of the obligations set forth in this Agreement. It is understood and agreed by the parties to this Agreement that the full responsibility for obtaining such clearances rests on the SCHOOL DISTRICT RECEIVING SERVICES.

- 9. Both parties to this Agreement agree to provide the State access to all relevant records which the State requires to determine either the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES'S or the SCHOOL DISTRICT RECEIVING SERVICES'S compliance with applicable Federal or State statutes or regulations with the effect of law, which regulate either the execution of the Agreement or the performance of obligations under the Agreement. Both parties further agree to retain all materials and records relevant to the execution or performance of the Agreement in accordance with the record retention requirements for such materials and records.
- 10. Both parties to this Agreement understand that they may receive and or come into contact with *protected health information* as defined by the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 ("HIPAA"). The Parties hereby acknowledge their respective responsibilities pursuant to HIPAA and shall comply with said Regulations, if applicable.
- 11. Both parties to this Agreement, their employees, and/or agents agree that all information obtained in connection with the services provided for in this Agreement is deemed confidential information and they shall not use, publish, discuss, disclose or communicate the contents of such information, directly or indirectly with third parties, except as provided for in this Agreement. It is further agreed that any information received by the parties, their employees and/or agents in connection with this Agreement, which concerns the personal, financial, or other affairs of their employees, agents, clients and/or students will be treated by the parties, their employees and agents in full confidence and will not be revealed to any other persons, firms or organizations. In addition, both parties agree that information concerning any student covered by the terms of this Agreement shall not be released except as provided for by applicable law, rule or regulation, including but not limited to the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act ("FERPA").
- 12. This Agreement may be terminated by either party upon thirty (30) days written notice to the other party in accordance with the Education Law. In the event of such termination, the parties will adjust the accounts due and the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES will undertake no additional expenditures not already provided. Upon any such termination, the parties shall endeavor in an orderly manner to wind down activities hereunder. In the event of

termination, all reports and services due to the SCHOOL DISTRICT RECEIVING SERVICES must be completed by the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES, its employees, and/or agents within thirty (30) days of the termination date.

- 13. Services provided pursuant to this Agreement shall be provided without regard to race, creed, color, sex, sexual orientation, national origin, religion, age, disability or sponsorship.
- 14. All notices required or permitted shall be made in writing by hand delivery or by registered or certified mail, or by a recognized courier service. Notice shall be deemed given on the date of delivery or upon receipt. Notice shall be delivered or mailed to:

- 15. The parties shall not assign, transfer, or convey any of its respective rights or obligations under this Agreement without the prior written consent of the non-assigning party.
- 16. This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of New York. If any portion of this Agreement is found by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unenforceable the remainder of this Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.
- 17. This Agreement constitutes the full and complete Agreement between the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES and the SCHOOL DISTRICT RECEIVING SERVICES and supersedes all prior written and oral agreements, commitments or understandings with respect thereto. This Agreement may not be altered, changed, added to, deleted from, or modified except through the mutual written consent of the parties.
- 18. The undersigned representative of the SCHOOL DISTRICT RECEIVING SERVICES hereby represents and warrants that the undersigned is an officer,

director, or agent of the SCHOOL DISTRICT RECEIVING SERVICES with full legal rights, power, and authority to enter into this Agreement on behalf of the SCHOOL DISTRICT RECEIVING SERVICES and bind the SCHOOL DISTRICT RECEIVING SERVICES with respect to the obligations enforceable against the SCHOOL DISTRICT RECEIVING SERVICES in accordance with terms.

- 19. The undersigned representative of the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES hereby represents and warrants that the undersigned is an officer, director, or agent of the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES with full legal rights, power, and authority to enter into this Agreement on behalf of the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES and bind the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES with respect to the obligations enforceable against the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES in accordance with terms.

CONTRACT FOR HEALTH AND WELFARE SERVICES

THIS AGREEMENT made in triplicate this First day of July 2013, by and between the Board of Education of the South Country Central School District, 189 Dunton Avenue, East Patchogue, New York, party of the first part, and the Board of Education, Center Moriches Union Free School District of Center Moriches, New York, party of the second part.

WITNESSETH, That whereas party of the first part has been duly empowered by the provisions of Section 912 of the Education Law to enter into a contract for the purpose of providing health and welfare services for children residing in said school district and attending nonpublic schools in Center Moriches School District, Center Moriches, New York, to begin on September 1, 2013, and to end June 30, 2014.

Now, Therefore, the said party of the first part hereby agrees to pay the party of the second part the sum of \$6, 527.97 for health and welfare services to be provided under Section 912 for 8 children residing in said school district of South Country Central School District, New York, and attending nonpublic schools in said Center Moriches Union Free School District, of Center Moriches, New York.

And the party of the second part hereby agrees with the party of the first part as follows:

The services provided by *Center Moriches UFSD* shall be consistent with the services available to students attending public schools within the *Center Moriches UFSD*.; and may include, but are not limited to:

- a. all services performed by a physician, physician assistant, dentist, dental hygienist, registered professional nurse, nurse practitioner, school psychologist, school social worker, or school speech therapist,
- b. dental prophylaxis,
- c. vision and hearing screening examinations,
- d. the taking of medical histories and the administration of health screening tests,
- e. the maintenance of cumulative health records, and
- f. the administration of emergency care programs for ill or injured students.

It is expressly understood and agreed between the parties that the services to be provided pursuant to this Agreement shall not include any teaching services.

2. The party of the second part will also furnish the following equipment to be used in providing such services if requested by the authorities in charge of the nonpublic school:

Supplies and equipment for use by physician, school nurse-teacher, psychologist, dental hygienist, social worker, and speech correctionist (i.e. scales, vision and hearing testing devices, health record forms, first-aid supplies, and all other readily transportable equipment and supplies pertaining to delivery of services).

It is expressly agreed by and between the parties hereto that the services agreed to be supplied under this contract shall not include any teaching services.

It is mutually agreed that this contract shall not become valid and binding upon either party thereto until the same shall be approved by the (District) superintendent of schools.

- 1. This Agreement shall take effect on the first day of July 2013, for the period of September 1, 2013 through June 30, 2014, and terminate on June 30, 2014, unless terminated earlier in accordance with the terms set forth herein.
- 2. SOUTH HUNTINGTON warrants that the health care services will be provided by licensed health care providers. SOUTH HUNTINGTON further represents that such services shall be performed by health care providers that are licensed under the laws of the State of New York, inclusive of New York State Department of Health and State Education Department Licensing requirements, if applicable. SOUTH HUNTINGTON further represents that such health care services will be in accord with all pertinent provisions of Federal, State, and local statutes, rules, regulations, including, Section 912 of the Education Law, and the student's IEP, if applicable. SOUTH HUNTINGTON shall certify that all health care providers possess documentation evidencing such license qualifications as required by Federal, State, or local statutes, rules, regulations, and orders.
- 3. SOUTH HUNTINGTON understands and agrees that it will comply and is responsible for complying with all applicable Federal, State and local statutes, rules and ordinances, with respect to the services herein described.
- 4. SOUTH HUNTINGTON shall provide the following health and welfare services, consisting of, but not limited to the following:

Nurse Services
Physician Evaluation
School Speech Correction Evaluation
School Psychological Evaluation
Maintain Health Records

Notification of Parents Regarding
Defects and Follow-Up
Vision and Hearing Screenings
Furnish First Aid Supplies
Provision of Medical Equipment
Required by School Nurse/Physician

The party of the second part shall furnish the equipment to be used in providing such services if requested by the authorities in charge of the non-public school(s). It is expressly understood and agreed between the parties that the services to be provided pursuant to this contract shall not include any teaching service. SOUTH HUNTINGTON shall make its

personnel available to South Country CSD for participation in District Child Study, 504 Team and Committee on Special Education meetings, as appropriate. South Country CSD shall notify SOUTH HUNTINGTON of the need for its presence at these meetings no later than twenty-one (21) days before the date of the meeting. Copies of all reports, testing and observation reports prepared in connection with this Agreement shall be furnished to South Country CSD upon request.

- 5. In full consideration for the services to be rendered by SOUTH HUNTINGTON to South Country CSD for the period of this Agreement, upon presentation of an invoice by SOUTH HUNTINGTON evidencing the allocation of such costs in accordance with the terms set forth herein, South Country CSD will pay SOUTH HUNTINGTON at the rate of \$807.41 per student for the period of September 2013 through June 2014. SOUTH HUNTINGTON shall immediately notify the South Country Central School District if a student is no longer receiving the services as described herein. Upon such notification, payment for students removed shall be pro-rated for the period of time services were provided to the student.
- 6. South Country CSD shall obtain whatever releases or other legal documents that are necessary in order that SOUTH HUNTINGTON may render full and complete performance of the obligations set forth in this Agreement. It is understood and agreed by the parties to this Agreement that the full responsibility for obtaining such clearances rests on South Country CSD.
- 7. South Country CSD agrees to provide the State access to all relevant records which the State requires to determine either SOUTH HUNTINGTON's or South Country CSD's compliance with applicable Federal or State statutes or regulations with the effect of law, which regulate either the execution of the Agreement or the performance of obligations under the Agreement. South Country CSD agrees to retain all materials and records relevant to the execution or performance of the Agreement in accordance with the record retention requirements for such materials and records.
- 8. Both parties to this Agreement understand that they may receive and or come into contact with *protected health information* as defined by the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 ("HIPAA"). The Parties hereby acknowledge their respective responsibilities pursuant to HIPAA and shall comply with said Regulations, if applicable.
- 9. South Country CSD, its employees, and/or agents agree that all information obtained in connection with the services provided for in this Agreement is deemed confidential information. South Country CSD, its employees, and agents shall not use, publish, discuss, disclose or communicate the contents of such information, directly or indirectly with third parties, except as provided for in this Agreement. South Country CSD further agrees that any information received by South Country CSD, its employees, and agents in connection with this Agreement which concerns the personal, financial, or other affairs of SOUTH HUNTINGTON, its employees, agents, clients, and/or students will be treated by South Country CSD, its employees, and agents in full confidence and will not be revealed to any other persons, firms, or organizations. In addition, both parties agree that information concerning any student covered by the terms of this Agreement shall not be released except as provided for by applicable law, rule or regulation, including but not limited to Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act ("FERPA").
- 10. This Agreement may be terminated by either party to the other party upon thirty (30) days written notice to the other party. In the event of such termination, the parties will adjust the accounts due and SOUTH HUNTINGTON will undertake no additional expenditures not already provided. Upon any such termination, the parties shall endeavor in an orderly manner to wind down activities hereunder. In the event of termination, all reports and services due to South Country CSD must be completed by SOUTH HUNTINGTON, its employees, and/or agents within thirty (30) days of the termination date.
- 11. Services provided pursuant to this agreement shall be provided without regard to race, creed, color, sex, sexual orientation, national origin, religion, age, disability or sponsorship.

- 12. All notices required or permitted shall be made in writing by hand delivery or by registered or certified mail, or by a recognized courier service. Notice shall be deemed given on the date of delivery or upon receipt. Notice shall be delivered or mailed to: SOUTH HUNTINGTON UNION FREE SCHOOL DISTRICT, 60 Weston Street, Huntington Station, New York 11746
- 13. The parties shall not assign, transfer, or convey any of its respective rights or obligations under this Agreement without the prior written consent of the non-assigning party.
- 14. This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of New York. If any portion of this Agreement is found by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unenforceable the remainder of this Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.
- 15. This Agreement constitutes the full and complete Agreement between SOUTH HUNTINGTON and South Country CSD, and supersedes all prior written and oral agreements, commitments or understandings with respect thereto. This Agreement may not be altered, changed, added to, deleted from, or modified except through the mutual written consent of the parties.
- 16. The undersigned representative of South Country CSD hereby represents and warrants that the undersigned is an officer, director, or agent of South Country CSD with full legal rights, power, and authority to enter into this Agreement on behalf of South Country CSD and bind South Country CSD with respect to the obligations enforceable against South Country CSD in accordance with terms.

HEALTH AND WELFARE SERVICES AGREEMENT

This Agreement is entered into this 17th Day of February, 2014 by and between the Board of Education of the South Country School District (hereinafter "SENDER"), having its principal place of business for the purpose of this Agreement at 189 Dunton Avenue, East Patchogue, NY 11772 and the Board of Education of the <u>Hicksville</u> School District (hereinafter "PROVIDER"), having its principal place of business for the purpose of this Agreement at 200 Division Avenue, Hicksville, New York, 11801.

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, SENDER is authorized pursuant to Section 912 of the Education Law, to enter into a contract with PROVIDER for the purpose of having PROVIDER provide health and welfare services to children residing in SENDER and attending a non-public school located in PROVIDER,

WHEREAS, certain students who are residents of SENDER are attending non-public schools located in PROVIDER,

WHEREAS, PROVIDER has received a request(s) from said non-public school(s) for the provision of health and welfare services to the aforementioned student(s),

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants contained in this Agreement, the parties hereby mutually agree as follows.

A. <u>TERM</u>

The term of this Agreement shall be from July 1, 2013 through June 30, 2014 inclusive, unless terminated early as provided for in this Agreement, and as authorized by law.

B. SERVICES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- 1. During the term of this Agreement, the services provided by PROVIDER to SENDER may include, but are not limited to the following
 - a. all services performed by a physician, physician assistant, dentist, dental hygienist, registered professional nurse, nurse practitioner, school psychologist, school social worker, or school speech therapist,
 - b. dental prophylaxis.
 - vision and hearing screening examinations,
 - d. the taking of medical histories and the administration of health screening tests.
 - e. the maintenance of cumulative health records, and
 - f. the administration of emergency care programs for ill or injured students.
 - It is expressly understood and agreed between the parties that the services to be provided pursuant to this Agreement shall not include any teaching services.
- The services provided by PROVIDER to SENDER shall be consistent with the services available to students attending public schools within the PROVIDER School District.
- 3. PROVIDER shall perform all services under this Agreement in accordance with each student's Individualized Education Plan (IEP) if applicable.
- 4. PROVIDER shall perform all services under this Agreement in accordance with all applicable Federal, State, and local laws, rules, and regulations, as well as the established policy guidance from the New York State Education Department.

- The services of a school psychologist and/or a school speech therapist may be rendered on nonpublic parochial school premises only to the extent that such services are diagnostic in nature. To the extent that such services are therapeutic or remedial in nature, they may be rendered to a student attending a nonpublic parochial school only on a religiously neutral site.
- 5. Services provided pursuant to this Agreement shall be provided without regard to race, creed, color, sex, sexual orientation, national origin, religion, age, disability, or sponsorship.
- 6. PROVIDER shall comply with all applicable provisions of the Safe Schools Against Violence in Education (SAVE) Act, including, but not limited to background checks and fingerprinting of all staff directly providing services to students. All persons providing services to students pursuant to this Agreement must receive clearance for employment by the New York State Education Department prior to the provision of such services.
- 7. PROVIDER warrants that the services will be provided by health care providers that are properly licensed under the laws of the State of New York.
- 8. PROVIDER shall furnish any supplies or equipment necessary to provide the services pursuant to this Agreement to the extent such items are not provided by the non-public school.
- 9. Both parties agree to provide the State access to all relevant records which the State requires to determine either PROVIDER's or SENDER's compliance with applicable Federal, State, or local laws, rules, or regulations with respect to provision of services pursuant to this Agreement. Both parties agree to retain all materials and records relevant to the execution or performance of their obligations pursuant to this Agreement in accordance with the record retention requirements for such materials and records.
- 10. Both parties to this Agreement understand that they may receive and/or come into contact with protected health information as defined by the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA). The parties hereby acknowledge their respective responsibilities pursuant to HIPAA and shall comply with said Regulations, if applicable.
- 11. Both parties, their employees, and/or agents agree that all information obtained in connection with the services performed pursuant to this Agreement is deemed confidential information. Both parties, their employees, and/or agents shall not use, publish, discuss, disclose or communicate the contents of such information, directly or indirectly with third parties, except as provided for in this Agreement. Both parties further agree that any information received by either party's employees and/or agents in connection with this Agreement which concerns the personal, financial, or other affairs of the parties, their employees, agents, and/or students will be treated as confidential and will not be revealed to any other persons, firms, organizations, or third parties. In addition, both parties agree that information concerning any student covered by the terms of this Agreement shall not be released except as provided for by applicable law, rule, or regulation, including but not limited to the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA).

C. <u>COMPENSATION</u>

- 1. In exchange for the provision of health and welfare services pursuant to this Agreement, SENDER agrees to pay PROVIDER the sum of \$600.02 per eligible pupil for the 2013-2014 school year. Said amount shall be prorated accordingly for each student to accurately reflect the actual period of time during which services were provided to each student.
- 2. SENDER shall pay PROVIDER within thirty (30) days of SENDER's receipt of a detailed written invoice from PROVIDER. Said invoice shall specify the services provided, dates that the invoice covers, and the total amount due for the period specified.

D. <u>MISCELLANEOUS</u>

1. <u>Termination</u>: This Agreement may only be terminated in accordance with applicable Law.

2. <u>Defense / Indemnification:</u>

- a. PROVIDER agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the SENDER, its officers, directors, agents, or employees against all claims, demands, actions, lawsuits, costs, damages and expenses, including attorneys' fees, judgments, fines and amounts arising from any willful act, omission, error, recklessness or negligence of the PROVIDER, its officers, directors, agents or employees in connection with the performance of services pursuant to this Agreement. The obligations pursuant to this provision shall survive the termination of this Agreement.
- b. SENDER agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the PROVIDER, its officers, directors, agents, or employees against all claims, demands, actions, lawsuits, costs, damages and expenses, including attorneys' fees, judgments, fines and amounts arising from any willful act, omission, error, recklessness or negligence of the SENDER, its officers, directors, agents or employees in connection with the performance of services pursuant to this Agreement. The obligations pursuant to this provision shall survive the termination of this Agreement.
- 3. <u>Notices</u>: All notices which are required or permitted under this Agreement shall be in writing, and shall be deemed to have been given if delivered personally or sent by registered or certified mail, addressed as follows:

- 4. <u>Assignment</u>: It is expressly understood that this Agreement shall not be assigned or transferred without prior written consent of the other party.
- 5. <u>No Waiver</u>: The failure of either party to enforce any provision of this Agreement shall not be construed as a waiver or limitation of that party's right to subsequently enforce every provision of this Agreement.
- 6. <u>Severability</u>: Should any provision of this Agreement, for any reason, be declared invalid and/or unenforceable, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining provisions of this Agreement. Such remaining provisions shall remain in full force and effect as if this Agreement had been executed with the invalid provision(s) eliminated.
- 7. <u>Governing Law</u>: This Agreement and the rights and obligations of the parties hereunder shall be construed in accordance with, and governed by, the laws and regulations of the State of New York and applicable Federal laws and regulations.
- 8. <u>Venue</u>: Any dispute arising under this Agreement shall be litigated in the Courts of Nassau County, New York.

- 9. <u>Entire Agreement</u>: This Agreement is the complete and exclusive statement of the Agreement between the parties, and supersedes all prior or contemporaneous, oral or written: agreements, proposals, understandings, representations, conditions or covenants between the parties relating to the subject matter of the Agreement.
- 10. <u>Amendment</u>: This Agreement may not be changed orally, but only by an Agreement, in writing, signed by authorized representatives of both parties.

HEALTH AND WELFARE SERVICE AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is made this day of December, 2013, by and between the BOARD OF EDUCATION, HAUPPAUGE UNION FREE SCHOOL DISTRICT (hereinafter referred to as the "SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES"), having its principal place of business at 495 Hoffman Lane, Hauppauge, NY 11788, and the BOARD OF EDUCATION, SOUTH COUNTRY CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT ("hereinafter referred to as the "SCHOOL DISTRICT RECEIVING SERVICES, having its principal place of business at 189 Dunton Avenue, East Patchogue, NY 11772.

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the School Districts who are the parties to this Agreement are duly empowered by Section 912 of the Education Law to enter into a contract for the purpose of providing and/or receiving health and welfare services;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants contained in this Agreement, the parties hereto mutually agree as follows:

- 1. DEFINITIONS: For the purposes of this Agreement,
 - a. "SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES" shall mean the School District in which the nonpublic school which has requested health and welfare services is located.
 - b. "SCHOOL DISTRICT RECEIVING SERVICES" shall mean the School District that is contracting for health and welfare services for its resident students who attend a nonpublic school located within the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES.
- 2. The term of this Agreement shall be from September 1, 2013 to June 30, 2014, inclusive, unless terminated earlier in accordance with the terms set forth herein.
- 3. If requested by a nonpublic school located within the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES, such School District shall provide health and welfare services to the pupils who attend such non-public school equivalent to the health and welfare services that it provides to the public school pupils enrolled in the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES. Such services shall consist of, but not limited to the following:
 - a. Nurse Services
 - b. Physician/Dental Services
 - c. School Speech Correction Services
 - d. School Psychological Services
 - e. School Social Work Services
 - f. Examinations for Participants in Athletics
 - g. Notification of Parents Regarding Defect and Follow-Up

- h. Visions and Hearing Tests
- i. First Aid Supplies and Health Record Forms
- j. Provision of Medical Equipment such as Audiometers and Mechanical Vision Testers Required by School Nurse/Physician

The services set forth above may be rendered on nonpublic school premises except for school psychological and speech correction services as further described below.

In addition to the requested services described above, the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES shall provide the following health and welfare services without the requirement that the non-public school request such services: (1) immunization mandates set forth in Sections 2164 and 2165 of the New York State Public Health Law and 10 NYCRR Sections 66-1 and 66-2; and (2) vision screening services to all new admissions within six (6) months of enrollment pursuant to Section 905(4) of the Education Law.

The SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES shall make its personnel available to the SCHOOL DISTRICT RECEIVING SERVICES for participation in District Child Study, 504 Team and Committee on Special Education meetings, as appropriate. The SCHOOL DISTRICT RECEIVING SERVICES shall notify the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES of the need for its presence at these meetings within reasonable time prior to the date of the meeting. Copies of all reports, testing and observation reports prepared in connection with this Agreement shall be furnished to the SCHOOL DISTRICT RECEIVING SERVICES upon request.

It is expressly understood and agreed between the parties that: (1) the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES may not provide such services to pupils attending nonpublic schools that are not available to the public school students enrolled in the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES; and (2) the services to be provided pursuant to this Agreement shall not include any teaching service.

- 4. The SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES warrants that such health care services (1) will be provided by licensed health and welfare providers; (2) shall be performed by health care providers that are licensed under the laws of the State of New York, inclusive of New York State Department of Health and State Education Department Licensing requirements, if applicable; and (3) will be in accord with all pertinent provisions of Federal, State, and local statutes, rules, and regulations, including, Section 912 of the Education Law, and the student's Individualized Education Plan ("IEP"), if applicable. The SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES shall certify that all health care providers possess documentation evidencing such license qualifications as required by Federal, State, or local statutes, rules, regulations and orders.
- 5. The SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES understands and agrees that it will comply and is responsible for complying with all applicable Federal, State, and local statutes, rules and ordinances, with respect to the services herein described.
- 6. In full consideration for the services to be rendered by the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES to the SCHOOL DISTRICT RECEIVING SERVICES for the period of this Agreement, upon presentation of an invoice by the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES evidencing the allocation of such costs in accordance with the terms set forth herein,

the SCHOOL DISTRICT RECEIVING SERVICES will pay the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES at the rate of \$820.62 per student for the period of September 2013 through June 2014.

- 7. THE SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES shall immediately notify the SCHOOL DISTRICT RECEIVING SERVICES if a student is no longer receiving the services described herein. Upon such notification, payment for students removed shall be pro-rated for the period of time services were provided to the student.
- 8. The SCHOOL DISTRICT RECEIVING SERVICES shall obtain whatever releases or other legal documents that are necessary in order that the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES may render full and complete performance of the obligations set forth in this Agreement. It is understood and agreed by the parties to this Agreement that the full responsibility for obtaining such clearances rests on the SCHOOL DISTRICT RECEIVING SERVICES.
- 9. Both parties to this Agreement agree to provide the State access to all relevant records which the State requires to determine the compliance with applicable Federal or State statutes or regulations with the effect of law, which regulate either the execution of the Agreement or the performance of obligations under the Agreement, of either the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES or the SCHOOL DISTRICT RECEIVING SERVICES. Both parties further agree to retain all materials and records relevant to the execution or performance of the Agreement in accordance with the record retention requirements for such materials and records.
- 10. Both parties to this Agreement understand that they may receive and or come into contact with *protected health information* as defined by the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 ("HIPAA"). The Parties hereby acknowledge their respective responsibilities pursuant to HIPAA and shall comply with said Regulations, if applicable.
- 11. Both parties to this Agreement, their employees, and/or agents agree that all information obtained in connection with the services provided for in this Agreement is deemed confidential information and they shall not use, publish, discuss, disclose or communicate the contents of such information, directly or indirectly with third parties, except as provided for in this Agreement. It is further agreed that any information received by the parties, their employees and/or agents in connection with this Agreement, which concerns the personal, financial, or other affairs of their employees, agents, clients and/or students will be treated by the parties, their employees and agents in full confidence and will not be revealed to any other persons, firms or organizations. In addition, both parties agree that information concerning any student covered by the terms of this Agreement shall not be released except as provided for by applicable law, rule or regulation, including but not limited to the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act ("FERPA").
- 12. This Agreement may be terminated by either party upon thirty (30) days written notice to the other party in accordance with the Education Law. In the event of such termination, the parties will adjust the accounts due and the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES will undertake no additional expenditures not already provided. Upon any such termination, the parties shall endeavor in an orderly manner to wind down activities hereunder. In the event of

termination, all reports and services due to the SCHOOL DISTRICT RECEIVING SERVICES must be completed by the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES, its employees, and/or agents within thirty (30) days of the termination date.

- 13. Services provided pursuant to this Agreement shall be provided without regard to race, creed, color, sex, sexual orientation, national origin, religion, age, disability or sponsorship.
- 14. All notices required or permitted shall be made in writing by hand delivery or by registered or certified mail, or by a recognized courier service. Notice shall be deemed given on the date of delivery or upon receipt. Notice shall be delivered or mailed to:

- 17. This Agreement constitutes the full and complete Agreement between the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES and the SCHOOL DISTRICT RECEIVING SERVICES and supersedes all prior written and oral agreements, commitments or understandings with respect thereto. This Agreement may not be altered, changed, added to, deleted from, or modified except through the mutual written consent of the parties.
- 18. The undersigned representative of the SCHOOL DISTRICT RECEIVING SERVICES hereby represents and warrants that the undersigned is an officer, director, or agent of the SCHOOL DISTRICT RECEIVING SERVICES with full legal rights, power, and authority to enter into this Agreement on behalf of the SCHOOL DISTRICT RECEIVING SERVICES and bind the SCHOOL DISTRICT RECEIVING SERVICES with respect to the obligations enforceable against the SCHOOL DISTRICT RECEIVING SERVICES in accordance with terms.
- 19. The undersigned representative of the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES hereby represents and warrants that the undersigned is an officer, director, or agent of the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES with full legal rights, power, and authority to enter into this Agreement on behalf of the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES and bind the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES with respect to the obligations

enforceable against the SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING SERVICES in accordance with terms.

CONSULTANT SERVICES CONTRACT

This Agreement is entered into this ______day of June, 2013 by and between the Board of Education of the South Country Central School District (hereinafter the "DISTRICT"), having its principal place of business for the purpose of this Agreement at 189 Dunton Avenue, East Patchogue, NY 11772, and Reach for the Stars Tutoring, Inc. (hereinafter "CONSULTANT"), having its principal place of business for the purpose of this Agreement at 12 Winside Lane Coram, New York 11727.

A. TERM

The term of this Agreement shall be from July 1, 2013 through June 30, 2014 inclusive, unless terminated early as provided for in this Agreement. It is understood that the DISTRICT is under no obligation to renew this Agreement upon its expiration.

B. <u>SERVICES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:</u>

- 1. During the term of this Agreement, CONSULTANT shall provide those services outlined in the attached Schedule "A", as specified and requested by the DISTRICT. CONSULTANT agrees to provide said services in accordance with applicable NYS Regulations, using only teachers certified by the New York State Education Department. For summer school courses, the program shall consist of twenty-four (24), two-hour sessions of instruction for each course (total of 48 hours of instruction). For Regents preparation courses, the program shall consist of twelve (12), two-hour sessions of instruction per course (total of 24 hours of instruction). Please see attached summer school service agreement.
- CONSULTANT shall abide by the DISTRICT'S calendar. The DISTRICT shall
 not be liable for work performed under this Agreement when class is not
 otherwise in session without the express written authorization of the DISTRICT.
- 3. The CONSULTANT shall provide the services set forth in this Agreement to those student(s) referred by the DISTRICT in writing.
- 4. If applicable, all services provided by CONSULTANT to students under this Agreement shall be in accordance with each student's Individualized Education Plan (IEP), as it may be modified from time to time. Prompt written notice shall be given by the DISTRICT to the CONSULTANT upon any modification of a student's IEP. The DISTRICT shall obtain whatever releases, prescriptions or other legal documents are necessary for the CONSULTANT to perform its services pursuant to this Agreement.

- 5. CONSULTANT shall perform all services under this Agreement in accordance with all applicable Federal, State and local laws, rules, and regulations, as well as established policy guidance from the New York State Education Department.
- 6. CONSULTANT shall comply with all applicable provisions of the Safe Schools Against Violence in Education (SAVE) Act, including, but not limited to background checks and fingerprinting of all staff directly providing services to students. All persons providing services to the DISTRICT pursuant to this Agreement must receive clearance for employment by the New York State Education Department prior to the provision of such services.
- 7. CONSULTANT represents that all services under this Agreement shall be provided by qualified individuals of good character, and in good professional standing. CONSULTANT represents that no individuals providing services under this Agreement are currently charged, nor in the past have been charged with any relevant criminal or professional misconduct or incompetence.
- 8. At the DISTRICT'S request, CONSULTANT shall provide copies of required licenses/certifications of all professionals providing services to student(s) under this Agreement. In the event that the required license/certification of any agent or employee of CONSULTANT providing services under this Agreement is revoked, terminated, suspended, or otherwise impaired, CONSULTANT shall immediately notify the DISTRICT in accordance with the requirements for all notices pursuant to this Agreement set forth below.
- 9. CONSULTANT shall observe and comply with all applicable DISTRICT Policies and Regulations while on the grounds of the DISTRICT or providing services pursuant to this Agreement.
- 10. CONSULTANT shall provide all services pursuant to this Agreement in a competent, professional, and timely manner.
- 11. If applicable, CONSULTANT will work cooperatively with the Committee on Special Education (CSE), the Committee on Pre-School Special Education (CPSE), the DISTRICT'S administrative staff, and medical staff. The CONSULTANT shall make relevant personnel available to participate in meetings of the DISTRICT'S CSE or CPSE when appropriate, upon reasonable prior notice to the CONSULTANT of such meetings.
- 12. CONSULTANT shall maintain records, logs, and/or reports in accordance with all applicable laws, regulations, requirements of the New York State Education Department or Health Department and DISTRICT policies and procedures in force during the term of this Agreement. The DISTRICT shall have the right to examine any or all records or accounts maintained and/or created by the MK

- CONSULTANT in connection with this Agreement, and upon request shall be provided copies of the same.
- 13. Both parties to this Agreement understand that they may receive and/or come into contact with protected health information as defined by the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA). The parties hereby acknowledge their respective responsibilities pursuant to HIPAA and shall comply with said Regulations, if applicable.
- 14. Both parties, their employees, and/or agents agree that all information obtained in connection with the services performed pursuant to this Agreement is deemed confidential information. Both parties, their employees, and/or agents shall not use, publish, discuss, disclose or communicate the contents of such information, directly or indirectly with third parties, except as provided for in this Agreement. Both parties further agree that any information received by either party's employees and/or agents in connection with this Agreement which concerns the personal, financial, or other affairs of the parties, their employees, agents, and/or students will be treated as confidential and will not be revealed to any other persons, firms, organizations, or third parties. In addition, both parties agree that information concerning any student covered by the terms of this Agreement shall not be released except as provided for by applicable law, rule, or regulation, including but not limited to the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA).
- 15. CONSULTANT shall attempt to provide substitute coverage in the event of the absence of the regularly scheduled service provider. The services of the substitute provider shall be in accordance with all terms and conditions of this Agreement.
- 16. In the event that the parent or person in parental relation to a student(s) receiving services pursuant to this Agreement initiates litigation in connection with such services, CONSULTANT shall promptly give written notice of same to the DISTRICT.
- 17. The DISTRICT reserves the right to reject any of CONSULTANT'S staff, which the DISTRICT, at its sole discretion, may deem unqualified.
- 18. CONSULTANT shall provide monthly attendance reports, progress reports, and report cards when required.
- 19. CONSULTANT shall pay all expenses incurred by it in connection with the performance of its duties hereunder, including, but not limited to automobile and/or travel expenses.

C. **INSURANCE**:

- 1. CONSULTANT, at its sole expense, shall procure and maintain such policies of commercial general liability, malpractice and other insurance as shall be necessary to insure the CONSULTANT and the DISTRICT, including the Board of Education, employees and volunteers, as additional insured, against any claim for liability, personal injury, or death occasioned directly or indirectly by CONSULTANT in connection with the performance of CONSULTANT'S responsibilities under this Agreement; each such policy shall provide a minimum coverage of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) per occurrence subject to an annual aggregate of Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000).
- 2. The insurance is to be underwritten by a licensed and/or admitted New York State Insurer with a minimum Bests rating of A-minus.
- 3. In the event any of the aforementioned insurance policies are cancelled or not renewed, the CONSULTANT shall notify the District in writing within thirty (30) days of such cancellation or non-renewal.
- 4. Upon the execution of this Agreement, CONSULTANT will supply the DISTRICT with a Certificate of Insurance including the DISTRICT, Board of Education, Employees and Volunteers as Additional Insured, a copy of the Declaration pages of the policies, and a copy of the additional insured endorsement.

D. <u>COMPENSATION</u>:

- 1. In full consideration for the services to be rendered by CONSULTANT to the DISTRICT for the term of this Agreement, the DISTRICT agrees to pay CONSULTANT in accordance with the attached Schedule "A".
 - * Elementary students shall receive (1) hour of instruction per day up to a maximum of five (5) hours of instruction per week; secondary students shall receive (2) hours of instruction per subject up to a maximum of ten (10) hours of instruction per week; services shall be provided at the student's home when a parent, guardian and/ or individual eighteen years of age or older is present. The presence of said parent, guardian and/ or individual eighteen years of age or older is not required in the event the student receiving instructional services is eighteen years of age or older. In the event a parent, guardian and/ or individual eighteen years of age or older is not present and is otherwise required, instruction shall be provided at an appropriate public place (i.e. library);
- 2. The CONSULTANT shall submit invoices for payment on a monthly basis. All invoices shall include time sheets and attendance, types of services rendered and fee payable and shall identify the names of the students who received services. The DISTRICT shall pay CONSULTANT within thirty (30) days of the DISTRICT'S receipt of such invoice.

- b. Neither CONSULTANT nor any of its employees, agents, or assigns will be eligible for any employee benefits whatsoever relative to this contract including, but not limited to, Social Security, New York State Worker's Compensation, unemployment insurance, New York State Employee's Retirement System, health or dental insurance, or malpractice insurance, or the like.
- c. The DISTRICT, if required by Federal or State requirements, will submit a Form 1099 and IT 2102.1 respectively at year-end to the Federal Government for all individuals having a gross income exceeding \$600, which thereupon will be reported for income tax purposes.

3. Defense / Indemnification:

a. CONSULTANT agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the DISTRICT, its officers, directors, agents, or employees against all claims, demands, actions, lawsuits, costs, damages and expenses, including attorneys' fees, judgments, fines and amounts arising from any willful act, omission, error, recklessness or negligence of the CONSULTANT, its officers, directors, agents or employees in connection with the performance of services pursuant to this Agreement. The obligations pursuant to this provision shall survive the termination of this Agreement.

4. Notices

a. All notices which are required or permitted under this Agreement shall be in writing, and shall be deemed to have been given if delivered personally or sent by registered or certified mail, addressed as follows:

CONSULTANT shall bear the cost of all expenses incurred as the result of doing business, including, but not limited to all fees, fines, licenses, bonds or taxes as well as the cost of all tools, vehicles or other equipment necessary for the implementation of services pursuant to this agreement.

1. Termination:

- 10. This Agreement may not be changed orally, but only by an Agreement, in writing, signed by authorized representatives of both parties.
- 11. This Agreement, and any amendments to this Agreement, will not be in effect until agreed to in writing and signed by authorized representatives of both parties.

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the DISTRICT OF LOCATION is required by Education Law Section 3602-c to provide special education services to parentally-placed students with disabilities, when such students attend private schools in the DISTRICT OF LOCATION, but reside in the DISTRICT OF RESIDENCE; and

WHEREAS, the DISTRICT OF LOCATION is a public school district within the State of New York authorized to provide special education and related services to students with disabilities;

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties mutually agree as follows:

A. <u>TERM</u>: The term of this Agreement shall be from July 1, 2013 through June 30, 2014 inclusive, unless terminated earlier as provided for in this Agreement.

B. <u>SERVICES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:</u>

- 1. The DISTRICT OF LOCATION shall develop an individualized education service program (IESP) for those student(s) listed on the attached "Confidential Schedule A," incorporated by reference herein and made a part of this Agreement, and shall provide the services set forth in such IESP attached as Schedule "B".
 - a. A student(s) and/or services may be added or deleted from the attached Schedules "A" and/or "B" at any time upon written notification to the DISTRICT OF RESIDENCE. Such written notification shall include a copy of any revised IESP. In such event, the payment amount owed by the DISTRICT OF RESIDENCE shall be adjusted accordingly.
- 2. The DISTRICT OF LOCATION represents and warrants that services to students under this Agreement shall be provided by individuals who are certified or licensed in accordance with applicable law, rules and regulations.

C. <u>COMPENSATION</u>:

1. The parties to this Agreement recognize that the authority for the DISTRICT OF RESIDENCE and the DISTRICT OF LOCATION to contract for the provision of special education services herein is derived from Education Law Section 3602-c, and related provisions of the Education Law and Regulations of the Commissioner of Education; and that these statutes and regulations may define the maximum costs that may be charged hereunder.

The DISTRICT OF LOCATION shall be entitled to bill the DISTRICT OF RESIDENCE for the services provided the students listed in Schedule "A" pursuant to this Agreement and the IESP attached as Schedule "B" in accordance with Education Law Section 3602-c and the Regulations or Rules of the Commissioner of Education.

- Requests for payment by the DISTRICT OF LOCATION shall be made by submission of a detailed written invoice to the DISTRICT OF RESIDENCE on a monthly basis which references the time period for which payment is being requested, and a breakdown of the total amount due for the period specified.
- 3. The DISTRICT OF RESIDENCE shall pay the DISTRICT OF LOCATION within forty-five (45) business days of receipt of each invoice by the DISTRICT OF RESIDENCE, unless the DISTRICT OF RESIDENCE sends the DISTRICT OF LOCATION a written notice disputing the invoice within forty-five (45) business days of its receipt. If a dispute arises, the parties shall have those legal rights and remedies provided by law and regulation.

D. TERMINATION.

This Agreement may be terminated by written notice of either party if (1) Schedule "A" has been deleted so that there are no students of the DISTRICT OF RESIDENCE entitled to special education services from the DISTRICT OF LOCATION, or (2) the State Education Department has issued guidelines to school districts governing the provision of special education services pursuant to Education Law 3602-c.

E. MISCELLANEOUS

1. All notices which are required or permitted under this Agreement shall be in writing, and shall be deemed to have been given if delivered personally or sent by registered or certified mail, addressed as follows:

- 2. It is expressly understood that this Agreement shall not be assigned or transferred without prior written consent of the other party.
- 3. The failure of either party to enforce any provision of this Agreement shall not be construed as a waiver or limitation of that party's right to subsequently enforce every provision of this Agreement.
- 4. Should any provision of this Agreement for any reason, be declared invalid and/or unenforceable such declaration shall not effect the validity of the remaining provisions of this Agreement. Such remaining provisions shall remain in full force and effect as if this Agreement had been executed with the invalid provision(s) eliminated.
- 5. This Agreement and the rights and obligations of the parties hereunder shall be construed in accordance with, and governed by, the laws and regulations of the State of New York and applicable Federal laws and regulations.
- 6. This Agreement, along with the attached Schedules "A" and "B", is the complete and exclusive statement of the Agreement between the parties, and supercedes all prior or contemporaneous, oral or written: agreements, proposals, understandings, representations, conditions or covenants between the parties relating to the subject matter of the Agreement.

- 7. Except for Schedules "A" and "B", this Agreement may not be changed orally, but only by an agreement, in writing, signed by authorized representatives of both parties.
- 8. It is expressly understood that nothing in this Agreement is intended to modify or vary the statutory and regulatory obligations or rights of the parties; nor is it intended to create any additional legal rights or obligations other than those imposed or provided by Federal or State law or regulation.
- 9. Nothing in this Agreement is intended to bestow any benefits or rights to any third parties who are not signatories to this Agreement. The parties to this Agreement shall have the sole right to enforce its terms.
- 10. Nothing in this Agreement is intended to place an obligation on the parties to ensure that the other is complying with its obligations under Federal or State law or regulation.

STAFFING AGREEMENT

This Agreement (the "Agreement") dated this 6th day of March 2014 by and between Home Care Therapies LLC/dba Horizon Healthcare Staffing ("Horizon") and South Country CSD and other related/affiliated organizations, corporations, or institutions hereinafter referred to as ("School District").

This Agreement shall commence on July 1, 2013 and continue thereafter through June 30, 2014 inclusive unless terminated as hereinafter specified in this Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION of the promises and mutual covenants contained herein, the parties hereto, intending to be legally bound, agree as follows:

1. Nature of Arrangement: Horizon shall provide to School District on an as-needed and as-requested basis, the full range of nursing and therapy staffing services including Registered Nurses, Licensed Practical Nurses, Certified Nurses Aides, Occupational Therapists, Physical Therapists, Speech/Language Therapists, COTAs and PTAs and paraprofessionals (herein referred to as "Clinicians").

2. Duties and Obligations of Horizon:

- A. Provision of services: Horizon shall provide and furnish to School District all services on an asneeded and as-requested basis. Services shall include provision of Clinicians as defined above upon the request of School District.
- B. Horizon shall have sole and direct responsibility for payment of wages and other compensation, reimbursement of expenses and compliance with federal, state and local tax withholding requirements pertaining to workman's compensation, social security, unemployment and other insurance requirements and obligations imposed on employers with regard to its personnel, who shall be deemed to be employees solely of Horizon.
- C. Horizon shall maintain records of FICA and federal and state tax withholding from Clinicians and allow School District access to these records upon request. Under no circumstances shall any Horizon Clinician be considered a direct employee, agent or servant of School District while said individual is performing services pursuant to this Agreement.
- D. Horizon warrants and represents that it has never been excluded from Medicare, Medicaid or any federally funded health care benefit program.
- E. Cooperation with School District: Horizon agrees to cooperate and participate with School District in any internal peer review, external audit systems and grievance procedures as may be established by School District. Horizon further agrees to participate in School District case conferences and continuing in-service education for Horizon's staff.
- F. Neither Horizon nor its staff shall share or accept any fee or gratuity from the student or student's family for services provided pursuant to this Agreement.

- G. Horizon shall instruct its staff that the student's right to confidentiality must be respected and that no information concerning the student shall be released to anyone without written permission of the parent and School District. In accordance with HIPAA and with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) privacy regulations issued December 20, 2000, Horizon will sign a "Business Associates Confidentiality Agreement" if requested and require all staff sent to School District to sign a "Confidentiality Agreement". Copies of each employee's signed Confidentiality Agreement shall be provided to the School District upon request.
- H. Horizon will meet the qualifications of School District defined as: Any Nurse wishing to work within schools must have a minimum of two (2) years recent and relevant clinical experience for substitute work and a minimum of one year recent and relevant clinical experience for 1:1 cases. All Nurses are asked to complete a school nursing and clinical skills checklist and submit their nursing license/certificate for verification; at least two (2) professional references are checked for every Horizon Nurse. Horizon will also obtain and submit (upon request) for each Nurse sent to School District a current and satisfactory health status report including documentation of chicken pox, measles, mumps, rubella, and varicella vaccines and/or positive titers. PPD testing/chest Xray with appropriate follow-up when needed is also required. In addition, Horizon agrees to check the Nurse Aide Registry to ensure that the Nurse sent to School District is eligible to work there. All Nurses take an NLN-accredited nursing exam and must complete a comprehensive school nursing orientation class tailored to the care of special needs students, including those with diabetes, insulin pumps, asthma, seizure disorders and allergies. Nurses will also complete a course on recognizing and managing concussions. For each Nurse sent to School District, malpractice insurance will be in effect, BLS/CPR certification must be current, and the Employment Eligibility Verification (Form I-9) will have been completed.
- Horizon's in-service training includes Fire & Safety, Infection Control, Non-Discrimination Regulations, HIPPA and Confidentiality of HIV - related information pursuant to 10 NYCRR 63.9.
- J. Horizon shall provide School District with a complete credential file including documentation of appropriate licensure and current registration and/or certification upon request.
- K. Employment of any Horizon Clinician will be subject to School District's approval.
- L. All Horizon Clinicians will be issued a photo ID badge by Horizon.
- M. Horizon shall make every reasonable effort to secure substitute Clinicians for School District upon request.

3. Duties and Obligations of Facility:

- A. Cancellation: School District may cancel a scheduled shift up to twelve (12) hours prior to the scheduled shift, otherwise a 50% surcharge will be billed for lost shift wages.
- B. Orientation: School District shall be responsible for orienting new Horizon Clinicians with the policy and procedures of the School District. School District will be billed for orientation time. If the Clinician voluntarily decides not to return to the School District, the orientation shift will not be billed.

C. School District agrees not to directly or indirectly hire, or use the services of any Clinician assigned by Horizon within one (1) year after the last date of the assignment without written permission from Horizon. In the event School District either: (i) employs any Clinician on a permanent or temporary basis, (ii) uses any Clinician's services in a consulting or freelance capacity, or (iii) uses any Clinician's services through another staffing company, School District agrees to pay Horizon a referral fee of \$5,000.

In the event one particular Clinician is utilized more than an accumulated 1170 hours through Horizon, Horizon will waive all fees if School District chooses to hire the individual directly.

D. Horizon complies with New York State SAVE legislation. We require all Clinicians to fingerprint in accordance with NYS requirements. It is the School District's responsibility to ensure that the individual's fingerprints have cleared.

4. Payment for Horizon Services:

A. The following hourly rates apply for nursing services*:

Horizon bills for total hours worked during the school day inclusive of transportation services when requested.

- If the Nurse works more than eight (8) hours in a particular day, Horizon will bill School District in fifteen (15) minute increments.
- If the same Nurse works at School District more than 40 billable hours during any week, ** Horizon will bill 1.5 times the rates above to account for overtime.
- One or two hour assignments will be billed at the visit rate of \$70/hr

* Group session (2 or more students in a group) rates are available upon request. Mandates of more than 30 minutes will be prorated.

Invoices remaining unpaid for more than 30 (thirty) days shall accrue interest at the lesser of 1.5% per month or the highest rate permitted by law. If upon receiving Horizon's invoice School

District disputes any portion of the invoice, School District must notify Horizon within ten (10) days of receipt. Failure to notify Horizon within this time frame shall be deemed acceptance to pay Horizon in full for the invoice. Further, School District shall provide Horizon with all supporting documentation upon which its dispute of the invoice is based. Such documentation shall be presented to Horizon within ten (10) days of invoice date. In no case shall any adjustment be made by School District without such documentation and without written authorization by Horizon. Payments due Horizon shall not be contingent upon School District's reimbursement from its third party providers. In the event that it becomes necessary to pursue the collection of any invoice pertinent to this Agreement, Horizon shall be entitled to collection costs and attorney fees.

C. The following holidays are billed at time and a half (School District is under no obligation to request nursing or therapy services on holidays):

- D. All time cards and "sign in/out" sheets (furnished to Clinicians by Horizon) from School District must be submitted prior to noon on Monday via fax (516) 719-7373, and mailed to 20 Jerusalem Avenue, 3rd floor, Hicksville, NY, 11801. Horizon will bill using timesheets. Signature of School District Supervisor will validate time sheet.
- E. School District will be notified in writing of any rate changes. Horizon will submit these rate changes with 30 days notice prior to rate change taking effect.
- 5. Horizon Hours of Operation: Horizon's hours of operation are 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year. Outside of normal business hours, District may call the 24 hour number (516-238-7846) to request services. This number is monitored by a member of Horizon's regular staff.
- 6. Horizon shall secure and maintain or cause to secure and maintain during the term of this Agreement comprehensive general and professional liability insurance covering Horizon Clinicians providing minimum limits of liability as follows:

Horizon will provide a copy of the Certificate of Insurance to School District upon request. If any other insurance certification is required by the District, Horizon will comply with that request in a timely manner.

7. Terms and Termination:

Either party may terminate this agreement in writing at any time with or without cause. Termination shall not relieve either party from financial obligations already incurred.

8. Indemnification:

School District shall indemnify and hold Horizon, including as applicable, Horizon Group Companies (Horizon Healthcare Staffing Corp. & Home Care Therapies LLC, Horizon Staffing Solutions, Horizon Staffing Resources) owners, partners, directors, shareholders, officers, employees and temporary staff harmless from and against all claims, demands, costs, expenses, liabilities and losses including reasonable attorney fees which may result against Horizon as a direct consequence of School District's acts, omissions, or performance of this Agreement, or which arise out of any alleged malpractice, malfeasance or neglect caused by School District, its employees, agents or other parties under its control or with whom it contracts in connection with the rendering or failure to render any service(s) to any person.

Horizon will indemnify and hold School District, including as applicable, District's owners, partners, shareholders, directors, officers, employees and agents harmless from and against all claims, demands, costs, expenses, liabilities and losses including reasonable attorney fees which may result against School District as a direct consequence of Horizon's acts, omissions, or performance of this Agreement, or which arise out of any alleged malpractice, malfeasance or neglect caused by Horizon, its employees, or other parties under its control or with whom it contracts in connection with the rendering or failure to render any service(s) to any person.

9. Entire Agreement:

This Agreement and the attachments hereto contain the entire understanding between the parties hereto with respect to the subject matter hereof and supersede all prior and contemporaneous agreements and understandings, inducements or conditions, express or implied, oral or written, except as herein contained. This Agreement may be amended at any time by a written agreement signed by both parties.

10. Non-discrimination:

The parties hereto hereby agree that neither party hereto nor any contractor, subcontractor, nor any person acting on their behalf, shall in any manner unlawfully discriminate against any person on account of race, sex, age, creed, color, national origin, disability, legally defined handicap, veteran status, marital status, sexual orientation or ability to pay.

11. Notices:

All notices required or permitted shall be given in writing by actual delivery or by registered or certified US mail postage prepaid, or by recognized courier service. Notice shall be deemed given on the date of delivery or receipt. Notice shall be delivered or mailed to:

Nothing in this Agreement shall be deemed to create any relationship of joint venture, employer and employee, or principal and agent between Horizon and School District. In performing services under this Agreement, Horizon is and will act at all times and in all respects as an independent contractor.
