The exceptions and recommendations noted during the period include the following:

- 1. Confirming Purchase order- During my review of purchase orders in the month of February 2014, I have found 4 instances in which the expense was incurred prior to the purchase order being approved by the purchasing agent. I have found that the purchases were not emergency situations, and the expense date was before the purchase order date. I recommend using "open" purchase orders for vendors used frequently in this situation. The vendors that were confirming purchases are detailed on the attached excel spreadsheet.

HEALTH AND WELFARE SERVICES AGREEMENT

This Agreement is entered into this _____ day of April, 2014 by and between the Board of Education of the Three Village Central School District of Brookhaven & Smithtown (hereinafter "THREE VILLAGE"), having its principal place of business for the purpose of this Agreement at 100 Suffolk Avenue, Stony Brook, New York 11790, and the Board of Education of the **SOUTH COUNTRY CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT** (hereinafter "SOUTH COUNTRY"), having its principal place of business for the purpose of this Agreement at 189 Dunton Avenue, East Patchogue, New York 11722.

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, SOUTH COUNTRY is authorized pursuant to Section 912 of the Education Law, to enter into a contract with THREE VILLAGE for the purpose of having THREE VILLAGE provide health and welfare services to children residing in SOUTH COUNTRY and attending a non-public school located in THREE VILLAGE.

WHEREAS, certain students who are residents of SOUTH COUNTRY are attending non-public schools located in THREE VILLAGE,

WHEREAS, THREE VILLAGE has received a request(s) from said non-public schools for the provision of health and welfare services to the aforementioned students,

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants contained in this Agreement, the parties hereby mutually agree as follows.

- 1. The term of this Agreement shall be from September 9, 2013 through June 27, 2014, inclusive.
- 2. THREE VILLAGE warrants that the health and welfare services will be provided by licensed health care providers. THREE VILLAGE further represents that such services shall be performed by health care providers that are licensed under the laws of the State of New York, including New York State Department of Health and the State Education Department licensing requirements, if applicable. THREE VILLAGE further represents that such services will be in accordance with all applicable provisions of Federal, State, and local laws, rules, and regulations, including Section 912 of the Education Law, and the student's IEP, if applicable. THREE VILLAGE shall certify that all service providers possess documentation evidencing such license qualifications as required by Federal, State, and local laws, rules, regulations and orders.
- 3. THREE VILLAGE understands and agrees that it will comply and is responsible for complying will all applicable Federal, State, and local laws, rules and regulations with respect to the services provided pursuant to this Agreement.
- 4. The services provided by THREE VILLAGE shall be consistent with the services available to students attending public schools within the THREE VILLAGE School District; and may include, but are not limited to:

- a. all services performed by a physician, physician assistant, dentist, dental hygienist, registered professional nurse, nurse practitioner, school psychologist, school social worker, or school speech therapist,
- b. dental prophylaxis,
- c. vision and hearing screening examinations,
- d. the taking of medical histories and the administration of health screening tests,
- e. the maintenance of cumulative health records, and
- f. the administration of emergency care programs for ill or injured students.

It is expressly understood and agreed between the parties that the services to be provided pursuant to this Agreement shall not include any teaching services.

- 5. In exchange for the provision of health and welfare services pursuant to this Agreement, SOUTH COUNTRY agrees to pay THREE VILLAGE the sum of <u>944.53</u> per eligible pupil for the 2013-2014 school year.

Both parties, their employees, and/or agents shall not use, publish, discuss, disclose or communicate the contents of such information, directly or indirectly with third parties, except as provided for in this Agreement. Both parties further agree that any information received by either party's employees and/or agents in connection with this Agreement which concerns the personal, financial, or other affairs of the parties, their employees, agents, and/or students will be treated as confidential and will not be revealed to any other persons, firms, organizations, or third parties. In addition, both parties agree that information concerning any student covered by the terms of this Agreement shall not be released except as provided for by applicable law, rule, or regulation, including but not limited to the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA).
- 13. Services provided pursuant to this Agreement shall be provided without regard to race, creed, color, sex, sexual orientation, national origin, religion, age, disability, or sponsorship.
- 14. All notices which are required or permitted under this Agreement shall be in writing, and shall be deemed to have been given if delivered personally or sent by registered or certified mail, addressed as follows:

HEALTH AND WELFARE SERVICES AGREEMENT

This Agreement is entered into this 28th day of January 2014, by and between the Board of Education of the Patchogue-Medford Union Free School District (hereinafter "Patchogue-Medford UFSD"), having its principal place of business for the purpose of this Agreement at 241 South Ocean Avenue, Patchogue, NY 11772, and the Board of Education of the South Country Central School District (hereinafter "South Country CSD"), having its principal place of business for the purpose of this Agreement at 189 Dunton Avenue, East Patchogue, NY 11772.

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, **South Country CSD** is authorized pursuant to Section 912 of the Education Law, to enter into a contract with **Patchogue-Medford UFSD** for the purpose of having **Patchogue Medford UFSD** provide health and welfare services to children residing in **South Country CSD** and attending a non-public school located in **Patchogue-Medford UFSD**.

WHEREAS, certain students who are residents of **South Country CSD** are attending non-public schools located in **Patchogue-Medford UFSD**,

WHEREAS, *Patchogue-Medford UFSD* has received a request(s) from said non-public schools for the provision of health and welfare services to the aforementioned students,

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants contained in this Agreement, the parties hereby mutually agree as follows.

- 1. The term of this Agreement shall be from September 1, 2013 to June 30, 2014 inclusive.
- 2. Patchogue-Medford UFSD warrants that the health and welfare services will be provided by licensed health care providers. Patchogue-Medford UFSD further represents that such services shall be performed by health care providers that are licensed under the laws of the State of New York, including New York State Department of Health and the State Education Department licensing requirements, if applicable. Patchogue-Medford UFSD further represents that such services will be in accordance with all applicable provisions of Federal, State, and local laws, rules, and regulations, including Section 912 of the Education Law, and the student's IEP, if applicable. Patchogue-Medford UFSD shall certify that all service providers possess documentation evidencing such license qualifications as required by Federal, State, and local laws, rules, regulations, and orders.
- 3. **Patchogue-Medford UFSD** understands and agrees that it will comply and is responsible for complying will all applicable Federal, State, and local laws, rules and regulations with respect to the services provided pursuant to this Agreement.

- 4. The services provided by *Patchogue-Medford UFSD* shall be consistent with the services available to students attending public schools within the *Patchogue-Medford UFSD*; and may include, but are not limited to:
 - a. all services performed by a physician, physician assistant, dentist, dental hygienist, registered professional nurse, nurse practitioner, school psychologist, school social worker, or school speech therapist,
 - b. dental prophylaxis,

 - e. the maintenance of cumulative health records, and
 - f. the administration of emergency care programs for ill or injured students.

Said invoice shall specify the services provided, dates that the invoice covers, and the total amount due for the period specified.

SPECIAL EDUCATION SERVICES CONTRACT

This Agreement is entered into this 15th day of July, 2013 by and between Board of Education of the South Country Central School District (hereinafter the "DISTRICT"), having its principal place of business for the purpose of this Agreement at 189 Dunton Avenue, East Patchogue, NY 11772 and the Crotched Mountain Rehabilitation Center (hereinafter the "SCHOOL"), having its principal place of business for the purpose of this Agreement at 1 Verney Drive, Greenfield, NH 03047.

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS the DISTRICT is authorized under the Education Law to contract with private, residential schools outside the State of New York for the instruction of students with disabilities in those situations where the DISTRICT is unable to provide for the education of such students with disabilities in special classes in the schools of the DISTRICT; and

WHEREAS, the SCHOOL is a private, residential school outside the State of New York authorized to provide special education and related services to students with disabilities;

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties mutually agree as follows:

A. <u>TERM</u>

The term of this Agreement shall be from July 1, 2013 through June 30, 2014 inclusive, unless terminated early as provided for in this Agreement. It is understood that the DISTRICT is under no obligation to renew this Agreement upon its expiration.

B. <u>SERVICES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:</u>

- During the term of this Agreement, the services to be provided by the SCHOOL shall include, but not be limited to the following:
 - Instructional Services
 - Special Education and Related Services as set forth in each student's Individualized Education Plan (IEP).
- 2. The SCHOOL shall provide the services set forth in this Agreement to those student(s) referred by the DISTRICT in writing.

- 3. All services provided by the SCHOOL to students under this Agreement shall be in accordance with each student's Individualized Education Program (IEP), as it may be modified from time to time. Prompt written notice shall be given by the DISTRICT to the SCHOOL upon any modification of a student's IEP.
- 4. The SCHOOL shall perform all services under this Agreement in accordance with all applicable Federal, State and local laws, rules, and regulations, as well as established policy guidance from the New York State Education Department.
- 5. The SCHOOL shall comply with all applicable provisions of the Safe Schools Against Violence in Education (SAVE) Act, including, but not limited to background checks and fingerprinting of all staff directly providing services to students. All persons providing services to the DISTRICT pursuant to this Agreement must receive clearance for employment by the New York State Education Department prior to the provision of such services.
- 6. The SCHOOL represents that services under this Agreement shall be provided by qualified individuals of good character and in good professional standing. The SCHOOL represents that no individuals providing services under this Agreement are currently charged, nor in the past have been charged with any relevant criminal or professional misconduct or incompetence.
- 7. At the DISTRICT'S request, the SCHOOL shall provide copies of required licenses/certifications of all professionals providing services to student(s) under this Agreement. In the event that the required license/certification of any agent or employee of the SCHOOL providing services under this Agreement is revoked, terminated, suspended, or otherwise impaired, the SCHOOL shall immediately notify the DISTRICT in accordance with the requirements for all notices pursuant to this Agreement set forth below.
- 8. The SCHOOL shall maintain its status as an approved special education provider. In the event that the SCHOOL fails to maintain such status, the SCHOOL shall immediately notify the DISTRICT. The DISTRICT shall not be required to pay the SCHOOL for services rendered during any period of time in which the SCHOOL fails to maintain its status as an approved special education provider, and the SCHOOL shall reimburse the DISTRICT for any payments already received for services rendered during said period of time.
- 9. The SCHOOL shall provide all services pursuant to this Agreement in a competent, professional and timely manner.
- 10. The SCHOOL will work cooperatively with the DISTRICT'S Committee on Special Education (CSE) and Committee on Pre-School Special Education (CPSE). The SCHOOL shall make relevant personnel available to participate in meetings of the DISTRICT's Committee on Special Education (CSE), where appropriate, upon reasonable prior notice to the SCHOOL of such meetings.

- 11. The SCHOOL shall maintain records, logs and/or reports in accordance with all applicable laws, regulations, and requirements of the New York State Education Department or Health Department. The DISTRICT shall have the right to examine any or all records or accounts maintained and/or created by the SCHOOL in connection with this Agreement, and upon request shall be entitled to copies of same.
- 12. Both parties to this Agreement understand that they may receive and/or come into contact with protected health information as defined by the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA). The parties hereby acknowledge their respective responsibilities pursuant to HIPAA and shall comply with said Regulations, if applicable.
- Both parties, their employees, and/or agents agree that all information obtained in connection with the services performed pursuant to this Agreement is deemed confidential information. Both parties, their employees, and/or agents shall not use, publish, discuss, disclose or communicate the contents of such information, directly or indirectly with third parties, except as provided for in this Agreement. Both parties further agree that any information received by either party's employees and/or agents in connection with this Agreement which concerns the personal, financial, or other affairs of the parties, their employees, agents, and/or students will be treated as confidential and will not be revealed to any other persons, firms, organizations, or third parties. - 14. The DISTRICT shall obtain whatever releases, prescriptions, or other legal documents that are necessary for the SCHOOL to provide services pursuant to this Agreement.
- 15. The DISTRICT shall obtain releases or other legal documents necessary for the SCHOOL to render full reports concerning the education and progress of the student(s) to the DISTRICT at the same time that such reports are made to the parent(s) of student(s) covered by the terms of this Agreement.
- 16. Upon reasonable prior written notice, the SCHOOL shall be subject to visitation by the DISTRICT and/or its designated representatives during the normal business hours of the SCHOOL.
- 17. In the event that the parent or person in parental relation to a student(s) receiving services pursuant to this Agreement files a request for an impartial hearing or administrative complaint or initiates litigation in connection with such services, the SCHOOL shall promptly give written notice of same to the DISTRICT.
- 18. Insurance

- a. The SCHOOL, at its sole expense, shall procure and maintain such policies of commercial general liability, malpractice and other insurance as shall be necessary to insure the SCHOOL and the DISTRICT, including the Board of Education, employees and volunteers, as additional insured, against any claim for liability, personal injury, or death occasioned directly or indirectly by the SCHOOL in connection with the performance of the SCHOOL'S responsibilities under this Agreement; each such policy shall provide a minimum coverage of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) per occurrence subject to an annual aggregate of Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000).
- b. The insurance is to be underwritten by a licensed and/or admitted New York State Insurer with a minimum Bests rating of A-minus.
- c. In the event any of the aforementioned insurance policies are cancelled or not renewed, the SCHOOL shall notify the DISTRICT in writing within thirty (30) days of such cancellation or non-renewal.
- d. Upon the execution of this Agreement, the SCHOOL will supply the DISTRICT with a Certificate of Insurance including the DISTRICT, Board of Education, Employees and Volunteers as Additional Insured, a copy of the Declaration pages of the policies, and a copy of the additional insured endorsement.

C. COMPENSATION:

- 1. The SCHOOL shall be entitled to recover tuition and maintenance for each student receiving services pursuant to this Agreement in accordance with the tuition rate established by the Commissioner of Education, and the maintenance rate established by the Commissioner of Social Services.
 - a. The payment of tuition and/or maintenance, respectively, shall be the responsibility of the appropriate agency/entity designated by law.
- Requests for payment by the SCHOOL shall be made by submission of a detailed written invoice to the DISTRICT which references the time period for which payment is being requested, and a breakdown of the total amount due for the period specified.
- 3. The DISTRICT shall pay the SCHOOL within thirty (30) days of receipt of each invoice by the DISTRICT.
- 4. The DISTRICT shall give the SCHOOL notice of any invoice disputes within twenty (20) days of its receipt of the invoice, and reserves the right to withhold payment pending the resolution of the dispute.

D. MISCELLANEOUS

1. Termination

- a. Either the DISTRICT or the SCHOOL may terminate this Agreement upon thirty (30) days prior written notice to the other party. Such notice shall be given in accordance with the requirements for all notices pursuant to this Agreement set forth below.
- b. The parties agree that either party's failure to comply with any terms or conditions of this Agreement will provide a basis for the other party to immediately terminate this Agreement without any further liability to the party which violated the Agreement.
- c. In the event the DISTRICT or the SCHOOL terminates this Agreement with or without cause, such termination of the Agreement shall not discharge the parties' existing obligations to each other as of the effective date of termination.

2. <u>Defense / Indemnification</u>

- a. 

All student records and logs will be the property of the District. The Consultant shall provide the District with a copy of any reports, testing, evaluations, or observations that are prepared in connection with the services provided by the Consultant under this Agreement.

Q. <u>CONFIDENTIALITY</u>

 The Consultant shall maintain the confidentiality of student records in accordance with all applicable laws, regulations, requirements of New York State Education Department and District policies and procedures in force during the term of this Agreement.

R. SIGNING OF ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

1. The Consultant agrees to complete and sign an Acknowledgement Form with regard to the New York State Education Department Waiver for the New York State Public Retirement System with respect to each owner of the Consultant and each principal employee of the Consultant. A schedule of such persons is attached as Exhibit A.

S. ENTIRE AGREEMENT:

1. This Agreement, along with the attached "Schedule A," is the complete and exclusive statement of the Agreement between the parties, and supersedes all prior or contemporaneous, oral or written: agreements, proposals, understandings, representations, conditions or covenants between the parties relating to the subject matter of the Agreement.
