TAX ANTICIPATION NOTE RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF NOT TO EXCEED \$25,000,000 TAX ANTICIPATION NOTES IN ANTICIPATION OF THE RECEIPT OF TAXES TO BE LEVIED FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 2015

RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF SOUTH COUNTRY CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT AT BROOKHAVEN, IN THE COUNTY OF SUFFOLK, NEW YORK, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Tax Anticipation Notes (herein called “Notes”) of South Country Central School District at Brookhaven, in the County of Suffolk, New York (herein called “District”), in the principal amount of not to exceed \$25,000,000, and any notes in renewal thereof, are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the provisions of Sections 24.00 and 39.00 of the Local Finance Law, constituting Chapter 33-a of the Consolidated Laws of the State of New York (herein called “Law”).

Section 2. The following additional matters are hereby determined and declared:

- (a) The Notes shall be issued in anticipation of the collection of real estate taxes to be levied for school purposes for the fiscal year commencing July 1, 2014 and ending June 30, 2015, and the proceeds of the Notes shall be used only for the purposes for which said taxes are levied.
- (b) The Notes shall mature within the period of one year from the date of their issuance.
- (c) The Notes are not issued in renewal of other notes.
- (d) The total amount of such taxes remains uncollected at the date of adoption of this resolution.

Section 3. The Notes hereby authorized shall contain the recital of validity prescribed by Section 52.00 of the Law and shall be general obligations of the District, and the faith and credit of the District are hereby

pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on the Notes and unless the Notes are otherwise paid or payment provided for, an amount sufficient for such payment shall be inserted in the budget of the District and a tax sufficient to provide for the payment thereof shall be levied and collected.

Section 4. Subject to the provisions of this resolution and the Law, and pursuant to Sections 50.00, 56.00, 60.00 and 61.00 of the Law, the power to sell and issue the Notes authorized pursuant hereto, or any renewals thereof, and to determine the terms, form and contents, including the manner of execution, of such Notes, and to execute arbitrage certifications relative thereto, is hereby delegated to the President of the Board of Education, the chief fiscal officer of the District.

Section 5. The Notes shall be executed in the name of the District by the manual signature of the President of the Board of Education, the Vice President of the Board of Education, the District Treasurer, the District Clerk, or such other officer of the District as shall be designated by the chief fiscal officer of the District, and shall have the corporate seal of the District impressed or imprinted thereon which corporate seal may be attested by the manual signature of the District Clerk.

Section 6. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

The Board of Education is required to establish a sufficient number of CSEs, to the extent such Committees are required, to ensure the timely evaluation and placement of students with disabilities.

The Board of Education authorizes the Director to make amendments to students' IEPs as outlined in the Part 200.4(g)(1)(2)(3) of the Regulations of the Commissioner.

Sub-Committees on Special Education

Education Law Section 4402 Regulations of the Commissioner Part 200.3(c)(4), the South Country Central School District will authorize Sub-Committees as established in the regulations to perform the functions of the Committee on Special Education (CSE), except when a student is considered for initial placement in:

1. a special class; or
2. a special class outside of the student's school of attendance; or
3. a school primarily serving students with disabilities in a school outside of the student's district.

The membership of each sub-committee shall include as per 200.3 (c)(2) CR, but not be limited to:

- The parent(s) of the student;
- Not less than one regular education teacher of the student whenever the student is, or may be, participating in the regular education environment;
- Not less than one of the student's special education teachers or, if appropriate, not less than one special education provider of the student;
- A representative of the school who is qualified to provide, administer, or supervise special education and who is knowledgeable about the general curriculum and who is knowledgeable about the availability of resources of the school district, who may also fulfill the requirement of subparagraph (iii) or (v) of this paragraph;
- A school psychologist, whenever a new psychological evaluation is reviewed or a change to a program option with a more intensive staff/student ratio, as set forth in section 200.6(h)(4) of the Part, is considered;
- An individual who can interpret the instructional implications of evaluation results, who may be a member appointed pursuant to subparagraphs (ii) through (v) or (vii) of this paragraph;
- Such other persons having knowledge or special expertise regarding the student, including related services personnel as appropriate, as the committee or the parent shall designate, and
- The student, if appropriate.

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The South Country Central School District will appoint building level Sub-Committees on Special Education and an Out-of-District Building Based Sub-Committee composed of the members listed below:

Upon receipt of a written request, the subcommittee shall immediately refer to the committee for its review any recommendation of the subcommittee concerning the identification, evaluation, educational placement or provision of a free appropriate public education to a student that is not acceptable to the parent or person in parental relationship to such student.

The regular education teacher of the student with a disability must, to the extent appropriate, participate in the development, review and revision of a student's IEP, including assisting in the determination of

- (1) appropriate positive behavioral intervention supports and other strategies for the student; and
- (2) supplementary aids and services, program modifications and supports for school personnel that will be provided for the student, consistent with section 200.4(d) of this Part.

* Teacher - (Education Law) Section 4402.1 adds the pupil's teacher to the list of required members of the Committee on Special Education and the Committee on Preschool Special Education. Therefore, I recommend that the Board of Education pass a resolution making each teacher a member of the Committee on Special Education. The Regulations of the Commissioner Part 200.1(pp), Part 200.1(yy) and 200.3(a)(1)(ii) mandates that if a child with a disability is being considered for, or is in any general education curriculum, not less than one general education teacher as well as no less than one special education teacher must be present at the CSE.

Psychologists for all bilingual/monolingual Spanish and LEP students who require bilingual evaluations (via appropriately certified individuals).

At the secondary level a guidance counselor shall attend all CSE meetings.

The Board of Education must appoint and maintain a list of surrogate parents. As defined in Part 200.1 (ccc) of the Regulations of the Commissioner of Education, a surrogate parent means a person appointed to act in place of parents or guardians when a child's parents or guardians are not known, or when after reasonable efforts, the Board of Education cannot discover the whereabouts of a parent or, or the student is an unaccompanied homeless youth or ward of the State and does not have a Parent who meets the definition of this Section.

I propose that the Board of Education appoint Mrs. Green as surrogate parent.

Additional parent members and surrogate parents will be added when they have received the required training during the 2014-15 school year.

The Part 200 Regulations of the Commissioner of Education Part 200 was used in preparation of this document which includes all amendments through April 2012.

Note: The Individuals with Disabilities Education Act was reauthorized in December 2004. The Federal Regulations were adopted on October 13, 2006. Any updates to the Part 200 dated after February 2014 that effect the CSE or CPSE membership will be sent to the Board of Education for approval.

**A Resolution In Support of a Berger Commission Approach to
Reforming Allocation of School Aid in New York State**

Whereas, all New York State public school students have a state constitutional right, upheld by the Court of Appeals in its 2006 ruling on the Campaign for Fiscal Equity (CFE) suit, to a “sound, basic education”, and

Whereas, the State of New York has “frozen” implementation of the Foundation Aid formula it agreed to execute to satisfy the Court of Appeals decision rendered in the CFE suit, and

Whereas, a comparative study of our nation’s fifty state school funding systems ranks New York State second nationally, with a letter grade of A for *Funding Adequacy*, but condemns our state’s flawed and inequitable approach to allocation of school aid with a letter grade of F, and a bottom-tier national ranking of 42nd in *Funding Distribution*, and

Whereas, the State of New York has shifted a significantly larger share of the costs of PK-12 education back onto local tax payers over the past decade, thus disproportionately hurting low property wealth school districts, and the students attending those districts, and

Whereas, New York State has enacted Local Property Tax Levy Cap legislation that virtually assures that existing per pupil funding disparities will widen each year, and

Whereas, the costs of resolving New York’s school funding equity problem are, based on past state legislative performance, highly likely to continue to increase in every year that school funding allocation decisions remain in the hands of the state legislature, and

Whereas, New York’s highly politicized system for allocating school funds places great pressure upon even the most conscientious state legislator to act in a selfish manner for the benefit of residents of their own legislative district even in violation of the state constitution’s guarantee, upheld by the Court of Appeals, that ALL children receive a “sound, basic education” with the consequence being that students of other legislative districts and regions have their educational opportunities curtailed,

Therefore, the School Board of the South Country Central School District, calls for the immediate establishment of a non-political *School Funding Equity Commission* that follows the model used by New York State when it established the Berger Commission to resolve the politically sensitive issue of hospital closure and repurposing,

Specifically, our Board of Education endorses the plan calling for the following actions to occur:

1. Education funding allocation decisions be de-coupled from the legislature by empowering a team of nationally recognized school finance experts to design a new school finance system that is research based and fair to all New York students and school districts,
2. That this team of nationally recognized school finance experts be charged to operate independently of political influence, and design a system for allocating school funds that is

equitable, predictable, sufficient, transparent and readily comprehensible by New York residents,

3. That the recommendation of this *School Funding Equity Commission* become law at a date certain unless that recommendation were to be specifically turned down by a vote of both houses of the legislature,

4. That the *School Funding Equity Commission* be charged to develop a plan with a three year phase-in to cushion districts from any dislocation a new funding system might impose, and

5. That after six years (three year phase-in and three years operation) a similar *Commission* be charged to review the impact of the new funding approach and make recommendations for improvements.

- Whereas:** The reduction in aid associated with the GEA has resulted in a cost shift to the local property tax payer in the South Country Central School District; and
- Whereas:** This cost shift has resulted in unsustainable measures being implemented to balance the South Country Central Schools budget, including the reduction and elimination of school programs, personnel, and services, and the reductions of school district reserve funds;
- Whereas:** Efforts by the South Country Central Schools to sustain programs and services and contain budgets are simultaneously constrained by Property Tax Cap Legislation, unfunded and underfunded mandates, state mandated increases in pension costs, and mandated implementation of Common Core Learning Standards and teacher/principal performance reviews; and
- Whereas:** State Funding is constitutionally mandates and essential to meet all mandates and obligations to maintain the quality of education in the South Country Central Schools; and
- Whereas:** New York State touts recent aid increases as generous support to schools, although overall, school districts are receiving very little additional aid when compared to 2008-09; and

The Board of Education recognizes the need to clearly define these expectations for acceptable conduct on school property, to identify the possible consequences of unacceptable conduct, and to ensure that discipline when necessary is administered promptly and fairly. To this end the Board approves these Progressive Discipline and Standards of Intervention.

PROGRESSIVE DISCIPLINE AND STANDARDS OF INTERVENTION

The South Country Central School District is committed to ensuring that our schools are safe, secure and orderly environments in which teaching and learning take place each day. A safe and supportive school depends upon the efforts of all members of the school community—teachers, students, administrators, parents, guidance counselors, school psychologists, social workers, safety personnel, related service providers, cafeteria, custodial and bus staff—to treat one another with mutual respect.

This document promotes responsible student behavior and an atmosphere of dignity and respect by establishing guidelines to help students as they strive to become productive citizens in a diverse society.

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STANDARDS OF BEHAVIOR

All members of the school community—students, staff and parents—must know and understand the standards of behavior which all students are expected to live up to and the consequences if these standards are not met.

The South Country Central School District Standards of Intervention and Discipline Measures (the Discipline Code) provides a description of conduct that does not meet the standards of behavior expected of students in the school district. It includes a range of guidance interventions and a range of permissible disciplinary and intervention measures which schools may use to address misbehavior.

The Discipline Code applies to all students.

CREATING SAFE, SUPPORTIVE AND INCLUSIVE SCHOOLS

PROMOTING POSITIVE STUDENT BEHAVIOR

Each school is expected to promote a positive school culture and climate that provides students with a supportive environment in which to grow both socially and academically. Schools are expected to take a proactive role in nurturing students' pro-social behavior by providing them with a range of positive behavioral supports as well as meaningful opportunities for social emotional learning.

Student engagement is integral to creating a positive school culture and climate that fosters students' social/emotional growth and academic achievement. Providing students with multiple opportunities to participate in a wide range of pro-social activities and, at the same time, bond with caring, supportive adults can help prevent negative behaviors.

Examples can include: providing students with meaningful opportunities to share ideas and concerns and participate in school-wide initiatives; student leadership development; periodic recognition of students' achievements in a range of academic and co-curricular areas; using corrective feedback; and developing school-wide positive behavior systems. Such opportunities, coupled with a comprehensive guidance program of prevention and intervention, provide students with the experiences, strategies, skills, and support they need to thrive.

Establishing a school-wide tiered framework of behavioral supports and interventions guides the entire school community toward following the school's rules and expectations, as well as the delivery of consistent and appropriate consequences, e.g., PBIS (Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports).

Effective social emotional learning helps students develop fundamental skills for life effectiveness, including: recognizing and managing emotions; developing caring and concern for others; establishing positive relationships; making responsible decisions; and handling challenging situations constructively and ethically. Such skills help prevent negative behaviors and the disciplinary consequences that result when students do not live up to behavioral standards.

School staff members are also responsible for addressing inappropriate student behaviors which disrupt learning. Administrators, teachers, counselors and other school staff are expected to engage all students in interventions and prevention strategies that address a student's behavioral issues and discuss these strategies with the student and his/her parent(s).

Interventions and prevention approaches include but are not limited to: guidance support and services to address personal and family circumstances; social/emotional learning, such as conflict resolution/peer mediation/negotiation, restorative circles, anger management, stress management, and/or communication skills acquisition; the use of alternate instructional materials and/or methods; enrichment services; alternate class placement; and/or development or review of functional behavioral assessments and behavioral intervention plans which should be developed and/or reviewed as an early intervention strategy.

If, at any time, school officials suspect that a student's difficulties may be the result of a disability which may require special education services, the student should be referred immediately to the Committee on Special Education (CSE).

Through the use of intervention and prevention strategies that engage students and give them a clear sense of purpose, school staff members facilitate students' academic and social-emotional growth and assist them in following school rules and policies.

PARENTS* AS PARTNERS

Students, parents and school personnel all have a role in making schools safe and must cooperate with one another to achieve this goal. School staff should keep parents informed of their child's behavior and enlist parents as partners in addressing areas of concern. Outreach to parents can include, but is not limited to: a phone call and/or written communication. As role models, parents and school staff should exhibit the behaviors which they would like to see students emulate.

To ensure that parents become active and involved partners in promoting a safe and supportive school environment, they must be familiar with the Discipline Code. Educators are responsible for informing parents about their child's behavior and for nurturing the skills students need to succeed in school and in society. Parents are encouraged to discuss with their child's teacher and other school staff issues that may affect student behavior and strategies that might be effective in working with the student.

It is important that there is maximum consultation and communication between the school and the home. Guidance conferences attended by the principal or his/her designee, a guidance counselor, the student's parent(s) and one or more of the student's teachers are an effective means of encouraging parental input and should be held with students when appropriate. Parents who want to discuss guidance interventions in response to student behavior should contact their child's school.

PARENT NOTIFICATION

School officials are responsible for sharing the information in this document with students, parents, and staff.

In the event a student engages in inappropriate behavior, the principal or principal's designee must report the behavior to the student's parent. When a student is believed to have committed a crime, the police must be summoned and the parent must be contacted.

* Whenever used in this document, the term "parent" means the student's parent(s) or guardian(s) or any person(s) in a parental or custodial relationship to the student, or the student, if she/he is an emancipated minor or has reached 18 years of age.

Attendance

Attendance at school is vital to a student's academic progress and success. School personnel must ensure that appropriate outreach, intervention and support are provided for students who exhibit attendance problems that may manifest themselves as truancy or patterns of unexcused absence or educational neglect.

In cases of truancy, school personnel must meet with the student and parent in order to determine needed supports and an appropriate course of action which may include, but is not limited to: guidance intervention, referral for counseling, and/or referral to after-school programs.

The school's Attendance or the school's student support team should review cases of chronic absenteeism and/or truancy and should involve guidance counselors, teachers, social workers and other school staff in facilitating a resolution. Cases of suspected educational neglect must be reported to appropriate agencies.

PROGRESSIVE DISCIPLINE

Understanding discipline as a “teachable moment” is fundamental to a positive approach to discipline. Progressive discipline uses incremental interventions to address inappropriate behavior with the ultimate goal of teaching pro-social behavior. Progressive discipline does not seek punishment. Instead, progressive discipline seeks concurrent accountability and behavioral change.

The goal is prevention of a recurrence of negative behavior by helping students learn from their mistakes. Essential to the implementation of progressive discipline is helping students who have engaged in unacceptable behavior to:

- understand why the behavior is unacceptable and the harm it has caused
- understand what they could have done differently in the same situation
- take responsibility for their actions
- be given the opportunity to learn pro-social strategies and skills to use in the future
- understand the progression of more stringent consequences if the behavior reoccurs

Determining the Disciplinary Response

School officials must consult this document (the Discipline Code) when determining which disciplinary measure to impose. In determining how to best address inappropriate conduct, it is necessary to evaluate the totality of the circumstances surrounding the conduct. The following facts must be considered prior to determining the appropriate disciplinary measures:

- the student’s age and maturity;
- the student’s disciplinary record (including the nature of any prior misconduct, the number of prior instances of misconduct, and the disciplinary and guidance intervention measures applied for each);
- the nature, severity and scope of the behavior;
- the circumstances/context in which the conduct occurred;
- the frequency and duration of the behavior;
- the number of persons involved in the behavior;
- the student’s IEP (Individualized Education Plan), BIP (Behavioral Intervention Plan) and 504 Accommodation Plan, if applicable.

Student support interventions are an essential adjunct to disciplinary measures.

Every reasonable effort must be made to correct student behavior through guidance interventions and other school-based resources. Student support interventions are essential because inappropriate behavior or violations of the Discipline Code may be symptomatic of more serious problems that students are experiencing. It is, therefore, important that school personnel be sensitive to issues that may influence the behavior of students and respond in a manner that is most supportive of their needs.

Appropriate disciplinary responses should emphasize prevention and effective intervention, prevent disruption to students’ education, and promote the development of a positive school culture.

For students with disabilities whose behavior impedes the student’s participation in school, a functional behavioral assessment (FBA) is an essential tool to understand the causes of the student’s behavior. A behavioral intervention plan (BIP) after an FBA provides specific approaches to address the student’s behavior.

PROGRESSIVE DISCIPLINE

Infraction Levels

The South Country Central School District Standards of Intervention and Discipline Measures holds students accountable for their behavior. Infractions are grouped into five levels based on the severity of the infraction. Whenever possible and appropriate, interventions should begin with the lowest level of disciplinary response.

Principals, teachers, school staff, students and parents need to know the disciplinary measures that can be taken when a student misbehaves or substantially disrupts a classroom. The Discipline Code is divided into two sections Section A Grades K-5 and Section B Grades 6-12 to ensure that the age and general maturity of the student are considered. Some infractions may not apply to students in grades K-3.

Progressive Infraction Levels	
Level 1	Uncooperative/Noncompliant Behavior
Level 2	Disorderly Behavior
Level 3	Disruptive Behavior
Level 4	Aggressive or Injurious/Harmful Behavior
Level 5	Seriously Dangerous or Violent Behavior

Each level of infractions contains possible student support interventions as well as a minimum to a maximum range of possible disciplinary responses that may be imposed by a teacher, principal or the Superintendent of Schools.

Where and When the Discipline Code Applies

The standards set forth in the Discipline Code apply to behavior:

- in school during school hours,
- before and after school, while on school property,
- while traveling on school transportation,
- at all school-sponsored events and
- on other-than-school property when such behavior can be demonstrated to negatively affect the educational process or to endanger the health, safety, morals, or welfare of the school community.

When misbehavior involves communication, gestures or expressive behavior, the infraction applies to oral, written or electronic communications, including but not limited to texting, e-mailing, and social networking.

The enumerated infractions are not all-inclusive. Students who engage in misconduct which is not listed are subject to appropriate disciplinary measures by the teacher, principal or the Superintendent of Schools based on violation of school rules. To ensure that staff, students and parents are aware of all expected standards of behavior, school rules must be in writing and distributed along with the Discipline Code.

The Discipline Code provides graduated accountability measures for students who engage in repeated misbehaviors despite prior interventions and/or prior imposition of appropriate disciplinary measures.

*The building principal or his/her designee will contact the appropriate local law enforcement agencies for those Code of Conduct violations that constitute a crime and substantially affect the order or security of a school.

More severe accountability measures will be imposed on those students who engage in a pattern of persistent misconduct. Whenever possible and appropriate, prior to imposing such penalties, school officials should exhaust less severe disciplinary responses and use guidance interventions.

STUDENT SUPPORT INTERVENTIONS

To promote positive behavior schools provide a range of prevention and intervention strategies and support services for students during and/or after school hours throughout the school year. When a student engages in misconduct, the Discipline Code provides a non-exhaustive list of guidance interventions that must be considered based on the type of behavior in which a student has engaged.

When used consistently and appropriately, student support interventions help improve student behavior, lower repeated misbehavior and contribute to a more positive school environment. Student support interventions are an integral part of a comprehensive response and schools are expected to provide support services at all stages of the disciplinary process, including during suspension. Support services may include any of the interventions or a combination of such services that best meet the needs of the individual student.

The purpose of the conference is to review the behavior, find solutions to the problem and address academic, personal and social issues that might have caused or contributed to the behavior.</p>	<p>Development of Individual Behavior Contract: The student meets with teachers to create a written contract that includes objectives and the specific performance tasks that the student will accomplish to meet those objectives. The contract is signed by the student and teacher and, where appropriate, by the parent.</p>
<p>Intervention by Counseling Staff: Where available, school-based counseling personnel and/or School-Based Mental Health programs offer a wide range of comprehensive and confidential mental health services and interventions including, but not limited to: assessments, individual, group and family therapy, teacher consultations and educational strategies for parents and staff.</p>	<p>Referral to Building Student Support Team: Student support teams are school-based teams that utilize a multidisciplinary approach to encourage student success through prevention and intervention strategies and supports. A case manager is identified for each student referral so that an individualized plan can be created to help students overcome their academic and/or socio-emotional difficulties.</p>
<p>Referral to a Community Based Organization (CBO): Students may be referred to a community-based organization for a wide range of services including after-school programming, individual or group counseling, leadership development, conflict resolution and tutoring.</p>	<p>Referral to Appropriate Substance Abuse Counseling Services: In the case where a student is presenting problems with substance abuse, including the use, possession or distribution of illegal drugs, drug paraphernalia, and/or alcohol, referrals should be made to counseling services that are either inside the school or through an outside community-based organization.</p>

Counselors will conference with parents on a regular basis to discuss the student's academic and personal progress.</p>	<p>School Community Service (with Parental Consent): Students may be provided with school community service opportunities so that they gain a greater appreciation of their school neighborhoods and develop skills to become positive social change agents. School community service can help students occupy their time with positive activities, avoid negative behavior and learn the value of service to others.</p>
<p>Mentoring Program: A mentoring program matches a mentor who may be a counselor, teacher, and/or leader with a protégé. The object of this relationship is to help the protégé in his/her personal, academic and social development.</p>	<p>Mentor/Coach: Assignment of a trained school staff member to provide transition support for a student returning from a Superintendent's Suspension or from a prolonged absence.</p>
<p>Referral to Counseling Services for Bias-Based Bullying, Intimidation or Harassment: When a student or group of students engages in bias-based bullying, intimidation or harassment of another student or group of students, both the victim and the student who engages in this behavior should be referred to separate appropriate counseling, support and education services provided by school staff or a community-based agency. Neither mediation nor conflict resolution are, under any circumstances, appropriate interventions for bias-based bullying, intimidation or harassment.</p>	<p>Referral to Counseling Services for Youth Relationship Abuse or Sexual Violence: When one person uses a pattern of threatened or actual physical, sexual, and/or emotional abuse to control a dating partner, the school should refer both the victim and the student who engages in this behavior to separate appropriate school or community-based agencies for counseling, support, and education. Neither mediation nor conflict resolution are, under any circumstances, appropriate interventions for suspected relationship abuse.</p>

ADDITIONAL CONSIDERATIONS FOR STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES

A functional behavioral assessment (FBA) is the process of determining why a student engages in behaviors that impede learning and how the behavior relates to the environment. An FBA is based on direct observation, information from teachers, providers and parents to understand the student's behavior, and when and why it occurs and to develop recommendations to address the behavior. An FBA must be considered when a student with a disability or a student who is presumed to have a disability

- exhibits persistent behaviors that impede his or her learning or that of others, despite consistently implemented general school-wide or classroom-wide interventions
- engages in behavior that puts the student or others at risk of harm
- is being considered by the CSE for a more restrictive program because of the student's behavior.

A student is presumed to have a disability if the parent has expressed concern in writing to supervisory or administrative personnel or to a teacher of the student that the student needs special education and related services or school staff expresses specific concerns about a pattern of behavior or the student has been referred for an initial evaluation. An FBA must be conducted or updated after a finding in a manifestation determination that behavior is a manifestation of a student's disability.

After completion of an FBA, the IEP team must consider whether a behavioral intervention plan (BIP) is needed or needs to be updated. A BIP is a plan that is based on the results of an FBA and, at a minimum, includes a description of the problem behavior, hypotheses as to why the behavior occurs, and intervention strategies that include positive behavioral supports and services to address the behavior.

STUDENT DRESS CODE: Grades K through 12

The Board of Education requires all students to attend school in appropriate attire. The Board of Education adopts this policy for the purposes of:

- 1) Promoting a more effective learning environment;
- 2) Improving student conduct and discipline;
- 3) Improving student academic performance;
- 4) Fostering student self-esteem;
- 5) Fostering school unity and pride.

While the school administration may require students participating in physical education classes to wear certain types of clothing such as sneakers, socks, shorts, and tee shirts, they may not prescribe a specific brand which students must wear.

This policy does not mean that student, faculty, or parent groups may not recommend appropriate dress for special occasions. It means that a student shall not be prevented from attending school or a school function, or otherwise be discriminated against, so long as his/her dress and appearance meet the requirements stated in this policy.

The responsibility for the dress and appearance of students shall rest with individual students and parents. They have the right to determine how the student shall dress, provided that such attire does not interfere with the operation of the school or infringe upon the general health, safety and welfare of District students or employees. Student dress and appearance must be in accordance with the District Code of Conduct. The administration is authorized to take action in instances where individual dress does not meet these stated requirements.

POLICY STUDENT BULLYING PREVENTION AND INTERVENTION

The Board of Education of the South Country Central School District is committed to providing an educational environment that promotes respect, dignity and equality. The Board recognizes that students' ability to learn and to meet high academic standards and a school's ability to educate its students are compromised by incidents of bullying or harassment. Such behavior affects not only the individuals who are its targets, but also those who participate in or witness such acts.

Therefore, it is the policy of the District to prohibit bullying and harassment on district property, district transportation, and at school-sponsored events and functions. Acts of bullying and harassment are prohibited, whether they are committed directly or indirectly, in person (face-to-face), or remotely by use of electronic technology, either on school property, at a school function, on a school or coach bus, or off school property where there is a sufficient nexus to the school environment.

DEFINITIONS:

"Bullying" and "Harassment"

1. "Bullying" and "harassment" mean the creation of a hostile educational environment by conduct of threats, intimidation or abuse, including cyberbullying or via electronic communication, that
 - a. has or would have the effect of unreasonably and substantially interfering with a student's educational performance, opportunities or benefits, or mental emotional or physical well-being; or
 - b. reasonably causes or would reasonably be expected to cause a student to fear for his or her physical safety; or
 - c. reasonably causes or would reasonably be expected to cause physical injury or emotional harm to a student; or
 - d. occurs off school property and creates or would foreseeably create a risk of substantial disruption within the school environment, where it is foreseeable that the conduct, threats, intimidation or abuse might reach school property.
2. "Bullying" and "harassment" can take many forms including, but not limited to: slurs, rumors, jokes, innuendo, demeaning comments, drawing cartoons, pranks, gestures, physical attacks, threats, or other written, verbal, physical, or electronic actions.
3. The basis for such conduct may include, but is not limited to, a person's actual or perceived race, color, weight, national origin, ethnic group, religion, religious practice, physical or mental ability or disability, sexual orientation, gender, sex, marital status, gender identity, socio-economic status, and familial status, as those terms are defined under the Education Law and the Regulations of the Commissioner of Education.
4. "Bullying" and "harassment" do not have to include the intent to harm, be directed at a specific target, or involve repeated incidents.

"Electronic communication" means a communication transmitted by means of an electronic device, including but not limited to, a telephone, cellular phone, computer, laptop, pager, or other hand-held device, communications transmitted through email, text message, instant message, voicemail, social networking sites, webpage, video, blogs and twitter.

REPORTING:

In order for the Board to effectively enforce this policy and to take prompt corrective measures when the policy is violated, it is essential that all victims and persons with knowledge of bullying, harassment, or similar behavior report it immediately to District administrative staff.

The District will promptly investigate all complaints, whether informal or formal, verbal or written. Complaints will be treated confidentially to the extent possible but limited disclosure may be required to complete a thorough investigation. If, after investigation, the District finds that there has been a violation of this policy, prompt corrective action will be taken that is reasonably calculated to end the harassment, bullying, and/or discrimination, eliminate any hostile environment, create a more positive school culture and climate, prevent recurrence of the behavior, and ensure the safety of the student or students against whom such behavior was directed.

Any person having reasonable cause to suspect that a student has been subjected to bullying or harassment who, acting in good faith, either reports such information to school officials, to the commissioner, or to law enforcement authorities, or otherwise participates in proceedings related to such bullying or harassment, shall have immunity from any civil liability arising from making such report or participating in the related investigation.

Retaliation for reporting incidents of bullying or harassment or for participation in a related investigation constitutes a violation of this policy. False reports or retaliation against the alleged bully or harasser also constitutes a violation of this policy. Acts of retaliation should be reported to the Administration. The District will investigate such reports and if, after investigation, the District finds that there has been a violation of this policy, prompt corrective action will be taken.

School employees who witness harassment, bullying, and/or discrimination or receive an oral or written report of harassment, bullying, and/or discrimination shall promptly orally notify the principal, superintendent, or their designee not later than one school day after such employee witnesses or receives a report of harassment, bullying, and/or discrimination;

Such school employee shall also file a written report in a manner prescribed by, as applicable, the school district, board of cooperative educational services (BOCES) or charter school with the principal, superintendent, or their designee no later than two school days after making an oral report;

The principal, superintendent or the principal's or superintendent's designee shall lead or supervise the thorough investigation of all reports of harassment, bullying and/or discrimination, and ensure that such investigation is completed promptly after receipt of any written reports made under the Dignity for All Students Act.

PROGRESSIVE LADDER OF SUPPORT AND DISCIPLINARY RESPONSES

The ladder of supports and disciplinary consequences below illustrates a progressive response to inappropriate behavior. Student misbehavior must be handled on a case by case basis. In all cases, implementation of appropriate interventions and disciplinary responses must take into account a number of factors including the nature and severity of the misconduct. In many cases, the use of primary responses and/or the use of guidance interventions may be most suitable. In other cases, a student's misconduct may require or be most appropriately addressed by a targeted or significant disciplinary response along with guidance interventions.



Kindergarten-Grade 5 LEVEL 1

CO-CURRICULAR & EXTRA-CURRICULAR ELIGIBILITY POLICY

This policy establishes the standards by which students shall conduct themselves if they choose to take advantage of the privileges afforded them by participating in activities defined in this policy. Students participating in activities shall commit themselves to meet the standards of this policy and of the District Code of Conduct at all times and in all places during a calendar year (365 days a year).

I. STATEMENT OF PHILOSOPHY

It is a privilege and an honor to participate in the full range of student activities provided by the South Country Central School District. These activities and participation in them contribute to each student's education by:

- A. promoting good citizenship and moral character
- B. developing discipline and skills necessary to personal success and well being
- C. promoting the image and identity of the school and community

Students who choose to participate in activities will conduct themselves appropriately at all times both on school grounds and away from the school. The responsibility of good conduct is an extension of the responsibility to represent the school and community in an appropriate manner.

II. STUDENT AND PARENT AGREEMENT

Before participation in any activity is permitted, all students who wish to participate in activities and their parent(s) shall receive a copy of this policy and shall sign an agreement indicating that they will abide by this policy.

III. APPLICABLE ACTIVITY PROGRAMS

This policy applies to all co-curricular / extra-curricular activities including, but not limited to:

- A. All interscholastic and intramural athletic activities
- B. All music, drama (public performances), cheerleading, pep band, dance team, and similar activities
- C. Student Council and other elected offices
- D. All other school clubs and activities that meet on a regular basis and/or for a specified purpose
- E. Field Trips, Class Trips, overnight trips, etc.

IV. APPLICATION OF ELIGIBILITY

Appropriate student behavior is required by, and has an impact on, all activities in which a student participates. If a student is participating in multiple activities at the same time when a violation occurs, the student shall lose the privilege to participate in all activities under this policy.

V. CONDUCT REQUIREMENTS

Students shall:

- A. Abide by this policy at all times and in all places.

- B. Abide by any additional specific rules and regulations that the coach/advisor of the activity has established (such as training hours, attendance at practice, etc.). Students will be required to sign a copy of a document acknowledging agreement to abide by coach or advisor rules prior to participation.

General Standard:

Good conduct consists of behavior which incorporates respect for and sensitivity to other persons, including a respect for their rights, property and personal dignity. Violations of this general standard and violations of the District Code of Conduct, the Athletic Code of Conduct, and/or the policies of NYSPHSAA Section 11 are subject to any applicable penalties set forth therein.

VI. VIOLATIONS AND PENALTIES

The following terms and definitions will be used regarding the interpretation of this Policy:

- Probation: The student will be permitted to participate in the total activity but will be subject to review by the Eligibility Committee.
- Ineligible: The student will be excluded from all contests, performances, and competitions for a period of time, but is entitled to attend and participate in practices and meetings.
- Disqualified: The student will be disqualified from all co- and extra-curricular activities during the period imposed (as defined in III. Applicable Activities Program)
- Eligibility Committee: Committee of school faculty and the principal's designee assigned to review attendance, academics and discipline, with the task of investigating all reported violations of the Eligibility Policy for validity and rendering decisions based on their findings.
- Season : The period of time for which the activity takes place. For an interscholastic sport, that period shall be from the first day of practice until the final official competition of the sport. For non-sports activities, that period shall be from the first meeting until the final or culminating activity is completed. This may mean that some activities have a season extending through the entire school year.

Violations of this policy shall fall into three (3) areas:

A. School and Class Attendance:

Violations of the school and class attendance policy shall be treated as a matter of student discipline in accordance with the District Code of Conduct and therefore be subject to any applicable penalties set forth therein.

All students who are scheduled to participate in an activity on any day that school is in session must attend school for 5 periods on the day of the activity and may not sign out of school prior to the end of the school day unless permission to participate has been granted by the school principal. In the event of extenuating circumstances, an explanation in writing accompanied by supporting documentation, if available, shall be required in order for the principal to grant such permission.

The decision of the principal regarding extenuating circumstances shall final and not subject to appeal.

B. Discipline:

1. Students suspended for a violation of the Code of Conduct for one (1) or two (2) days, either in school or out of school, shall not be permitted to participate in any co-curricular or extracurricular activity for the duration of the suspension.
2. A student suspended for a violation of the Code of Conduct and who has accumulated up to three (3) or four (4) days shall be disqualified to participate in any co-curricular or extracurricular activity for the duration of the suspension, and for an additional period of one (1) week after the expiration of the suspension.
3. A student suspended out of school for a violation of the Code of Conduct and who has accumulated up to five (5) days shall be disqualified to participate in any co-curricular or extracurricular activity for the duration of the suspension, and for a period of two (2) weeks after the expiration of the suspension.
4. A student suspended out of school for a violation of the Code of Conduct for more than a total of five (5) days for separate incidents occurring during the school year shall not participate in any co-curricular or extracurricular activity for the duration of the suspension, and for an additional one (1) week for each day of suspension.
5. A student suspended out of school for violation of the Code of Conduct for five (5) days for any single offense, found guilty at a Superintendent's Hearing, and given an additional period of suspension, shall be disqualified from any co-curricular or extracurricular activity for the duration of the suspension, and for an additional three (3) weeks after the expiration of the suspension.

Once the determination is made that a student has violated this policy as a result of disciplinary action in violation of the Code of Conduct, a school administrator shall make a determination of the appropriate penalty under this policy. In instances of an appeal, determination on a student's eligibility status shall be determined by the Eligibility Committee. The student and his/her parent(s) shall be verbally informed within twenty-four (24) hours, followed by written notice, of this decision (the nature of the violation and the determination of the penalty) by mailing the same to the student's residence within two school days of the determination. In lieu of mailing, written notice may also be personally given to the parent/guardian or student.

C. Academic Standing

1. Levels of Eligibility:

- a. Students with two (2) failures on a progress report or report card will be placed on a five (5) week probationary period.
- b. Students who fail (2) major subject and (1) minor subject are ineligible until the following quarter progress report and / or report card is issued and said student is passing two of the courses.
- c. Any student who fails (3) major subjects or more is deemed disqualified for participation.
- d. Students who fail Physical Education are disqualified from participation in interscholastic athletics until a passing grade is achieved on the next progress report and / or report card.

2. Determination of Eligibility:

- a. Academic eligibility for fall sports season shall be determined by the Fourth Quarter report card (final course grade) issued the previous June, the progress report issued in the first quarter and/or the first quarter report card issued in November.
 - Students earning passing marks during the summer for the failed course(s) will not be subject to the probationary period in the fall.
 - b. Academic eligibility for the winter sports season shall be determined by the first quarter progress report, the first quarter report card issued in November, the second quarter progress report issued in December, and/or the second quarter report card issued in February.
 - c. Academic eligibility for the spring sports season shall be determined by the second quarter report card issued in February, the third quarter progress report issued in March, the third quarter report card issued in April, and/or the fourth quarter progress report issued in May.
 - d. The following criteria must be met for high school eligibility:
 - Sophomores: must have earned a minimum of 5 credits during freshman year, including 1/2 credit of physical education per year.
 - Juniors: must have earned a minimum of 10 credits by the end of their sophomore year, including 1/2 credit of physical education per year.
 - Seniors: must have earned 15 credits by the end of junior year and must be registered for the minimum number of credits required for graduation, including 1/2 credit of physical education per year.
3. Students failing two (2) subjects as noted on a progress report or a report card will be placed on academic probation.
- a. Once the determination is made that a student has violated this policy based on academic standing, a student placed on academic probation will be subject to a five (5) week probationary period during which the student will remain eligible to participate in co- and extra-curricular activities. An Academic Support Plan shall be developed through the Guidance Department and the building student support team (SST). Notification will be sent home to parents of students placed on academic probation within five (5) school days of the issuance of the distribution of either the applicable progress report or report card.
 - b. An Academic Support Plan shall consist of:
 - Regular attendance and participation in Extra help sessions/Study Center
 - Regular attendance and participation in after school tutoring/mentoring
 - Guidance support
 - Weekly Eligibility Reports (WERs) for each subject that include:
 - Weekly class attendance
 - Weekly academic average
 - Quarterly academic average to date
 - Homework assignments given/completed

- Teacher comments on weekly performance
- Extra help/mentoring/tutoring attendance and participation

c. Weekly Eligibility Reports (WERs) shall be reviewed by the appropriate coach and/or club-activity advisor.

4. Following the five (5) week probationary period, if a student continues to fail any two (2) subjects as indicated on the quarterly progress report, the quarterly report card, or the Weekly Eligibility Reports, he/she will become ineligible as defined in VI. Violations and Penalties. Notification will be sent home to parents of students found to be ineligible within five (5) school days of the determination by the Eligibility Committee.
5. Following the five (5) week ineligibility period, if a student continues to fail any two (2) subjects as indicated on the quarterly progress report, the quarterly report card, or the Weekly Eligibility Reports, he/she will be disqualified from all activities. Notification will be sent home to parents of students found to be disqualified within five (5) school days of the determination by the Eligibility Committee.

Disqualification shall continue so long as a student is failing two (2) or more subjects as indicated on the quarterly progress report, the quarterly report card, or the Weekly Eligibility Reports.

VII. RIGHT TO DUE PROCESS AND APPEAL

The decision of the Eligibility Committee regarding a violation of this policy other than a coach's supplementary rules may be appealed to the principal except as otherwise set forth herein. The appeal to the principal shall be in writing and delivered to the principal or the principal's secretary within three (3) school days of receipt of the Eligibility Committee's written decision.

Grounds for appeal may include, but not be limited to:

- an error in the computation of the student's grade(s)
- additional academic information not available to the Eligibility Committee when it rendered its decision
- additional discipline information not available to the administration and/or Eligibility Committee when a decision was initially rendered
- failure by the district to comply with the various time limits established by the policy
- failure by the district to comply with the Academic Support Plan provisions

The following shall not represent sufficient grounds for appeal:

- disagreement with the policy on philosophical grounds

The written appeal to the principal shall specify the ground(s) for the appeal and must include all supporting information, facts, and documentation. The parents and student shall have the opportunity to meet with the principal prior to a decision on the appeal being made. However, the time limit for the principal's written decision shall not be affected by the meeting, or lack thereof, with the parents and student.

The principal shall provide a written decision to the parents and student postmarked within three (3) school days of receipt of the original written appeal.

The student shall remain ineligible until a determination is rendered by the principal.



1. **Subscription.** Customer is purchasing a non-exclusive, non-transferable, non-assignable, terminable subscription ("Subscription") for use of Frontline's employee replacement system ("Aesop®") by Customer and those employees Customer registers on Aesop® as "Designated Employees."
2. **Term.** The Subscription shall begin upon the execution of this Agreement and continue through the Initial Term, set forth on the first page of this Agreement. If neither party has given the other at least thirty (30) days written notice of its intent not to renew prior to the end of the Initial Term or any Renewal Term, the Subscription shall automatically renew for the next year (each, a "Renewal Term").
3. **Payment.**
 1. The Implementation and System(s) Integration Setup fees set forth on the first page of this Agreement will be invoiced to Customer by Frontline upon execution of this Agreement; but if Customer terminates this Agreement before completion of the implementation process, Frontline will refund the Implementation and System(s) Integration Setup fees on a pro-rata basis, based on a six (6) week setup schedule. MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT, made the ____ day of August, 2014, by and between the BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE SOUTH COUNTRY CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT (hereinafter "District") and Local 1000, Civil Service Employees Association, Inc., American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees, AFL-CIO, Suffolk Educational Local #870, South Country School Unit (hereafter referred to as the "CSEA").

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the District and the CSEA are parties to an Agreement ("Agreement") with a term from July 1, 2009 through June 30, 2014; and

WHEREAS, the District and the CSEA are desirous of amending the Agreement so as to reconfigure the work year for the position of School Health Aide from 12 months to 10 months;

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties mutually agree as follows:

1. Article III, Section "1" of the Parties' Agreement shall be amended to include the following paragraph, to be inserted following the paragraph beginning "*Effective July 1, 2005...*", with the remaining benefits and entitlements to be negotiated by the Parties:

Effective August 7, 2014 the position "School Health Aide" shall be a full-time ten (10) month position. The salary for said position for the 2014-2015 school year shall be affixed by prorating the salary for the former twelve (12) month position. Beginning with the 2015-2016 school year, said salary, as determined herein, shall thereafter be subject to the applicable annual salary increases, if any, set forth in the within Agreement.

2. Except as specifically set forth herein, this Memorandum of Agreement shall not be construed as modifying any other terms of the Collective Bargaining Agreement as between the District and the CSEA, or any practices which may exist as between the parties.

3. It is understood that none of the obligations of either party shall become operative unless and until this Memorandum of Agreement and all of its terms are formally accepted and approved by the Board of Education.

4. This Memorandum of Agreement, and all of its terms and conditions, shall not be binding until fully executed by the parties.

5. This Memorandum of Agreement is subject to and contingent upon approval by the Board of Education.

THIS AGREEMENT made this 19th of June, 2014 and entered into, by and between the Board of Education of the South Country Central School District (the "District"), a public body corporate with its principal place of business for purposes of this agreement at 189 Dunton Avenue, East Patchogue, NY 11772 and Reddy Consulting Services, Inc ("RCS") with its principal place of business for purposes of this agreement at 460 Rowlinson Drive, Shirley, NY 11967.

WHEREAS, RCS has represented to the District that it has expertise in the preparation, submission and reconciliation of Medicaid reimbursement claims resulting in the collection of funds that are due organizations such as the District for the past and future services; and the District is desirous of contracting with a firm with the expertise in the field of collection from the District and subsequent reconciliation of Medicaid claims due the District for services rendered to disabled children in the School District and others, based upon information furnished to and relied upon by RCS.

WHEREAS, the District and RCS have agreed upon the following terms and conditions for RCS to perform services that the District needs in order to be fully compensated for rendering services to disabled persons and others in accordance with the laws of the United States and the State of New York for the mutual benefit of both organizations.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and obligations set forth herein and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt of which and the adequacy of which is hereby acknowledged by each of the parties, it is agreed as follows:

1. TERM

The term of this Agreement shall be from July 1, 2014 through June 30, 2015 inclusive unless terminated early as provided for in this Agreement. It is understood that the DISTRICT is under no obligation to renew this Agreement upon its expiration.

2. MONTHLY SERVICE FEE

The District agrees to pay RCS a fee at the rate in the manner that is set forth in Appendix A. Invoices shall be generated by RCS on the date agreed set forth in Appendix A of this agreement. RCS payment requests with supporting documentation will be sent to the appropriate departments finance unit, as set forth in Appendix A of said Agreement. The District shall make payment to RCS within 30 days of receipt of invoice. Upon the District's request, RCS shall provide documentation and verification of any Medicaid-in-Education revenue resulting from RCS finding and actions.

3. RCS RESPONSIBILITIES

RCS will do the following:

- 3.1 Identify and create Medicaid demographic diskettes and submit to the Central New York's Regional Information Center MEDWeb ("CNYRIC") program for processing.
- 3.2 Locate, review and maintain billable data pertaining to the District's Medicaid Eligible students receiving a service(s) per the student(s) Individual Education Plan (IEP).
- 3.3 Compose the District's Medicaid claims, from information furnished by the District, obtain the District's signature and submit to CNYRIC for processing.
- 3.4 Reconcile Medicaid Remittance payments and statements. Investigate discrepancies and resubmit rejections.
- 3.5 Maintain Medicaid documentation with approval by the District, in accordance with State and Federal requirements.
- 3.6 Maintain financial documentation pertaining to Medicaid claims.
- 3.7 Maintain log for Med Web Control #s.
- 3.8 Provide the District with reports or updates in regards to Medicaid maximization and progress.
- 3.9 Assist the District at audits conducted by Federal and State oversight agencies concerning services provided by RCS during the term of this Agreement and in accordance to the fee set forth in Appendix A of this agreement.
- 3.10 Provide training to service providers, special education staff and finance staff regarding appropriate Medicaid billing practices.
- 3.11 Provide monthly service report forms and missing lists to district(s) for assistance in obtaining missing information from service provider(s).
- 3.12 Attend Medicaid meetings at County, State and district(s) RIC and report Meeting Minutes to Special Education Director and Finance Director.

4. DISTRICT'S RESPONSIBILITIES

The District will provide the following to RCS upon which RCS will rely:

- 4.1 Provide a demographic report of all special education students and referrals (to develop and maintain Medicaid Eligibility List).
- 4.2 Provide consultant with district(s) BedsCode Number, Regional Information Center Number (RIC), Provider Number
- 4.3 A copy of the current RIC diskette containing Medicaid Eligibility and Medicaid Remittance information. Medicaid Eligibility List, Non/Near Match List, current Remittance statement, district(s) Special Transportation policy, district(s) School Calendars for contractual periods.
- 4.4 Access to Annual Reviews, Amended/Requested Reviews, Re-evaluations, Attendance, Evaluation(s), Monthly Service Reports, Prescription(s), Progress Notes, Referral(s), SSI letter for appropriate students.
- 4.5 Access to provider(s) Credentials, Attendance, Service Logs, and Bills - showing actual dates of service for each student, notification of new providers or changing providers.

- 4.6 Access to “Under the Direction of Statements”, SLP logs showing observance of the TSSH whom they are providing “Under the Direction of”, Statements of Re-Assignments and Provider Agreements for outside providers.
- 4.7 Copies of all Remittance payments and statements for reconciliation.
- 4.8 Notify consultant of all State, Federal and Nassau BOCES Medicaid meetings and or updates pertaining to Medicaid in Education Program of which the District has notice.

5. CONFIDENTIALITY

Both parties to this Agreement understand that they may receive and/or come into contact with protected health information as defined by the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA). The parties hereby acknowledge their respective responsibilities pursuant to HIPAA and shall comply with said Regulations, if applicable.

Both parties, their employees, and/or agents agree that all information obtained in connection with the services performed pursuant to this Agreement is deemed confidential information. Both parties, their employees, and/or agents shall not use, publish, discuss, disclose or communicate the contents of such information, directly or indirectly with third parties, except as provided for in this Agreement. Both parties further agree that any information received by either party’s employees and/or agents in connection with this Agreement which concerns the personal, financial, or other affairs of the parties, their employees, agents, and/or students will be treated as confidential and will not be revealed to any other persons, firms, organizations, or third parties. In addition, both parties agree that information concerning any student covered by the terms of this Agreement shall not be released except as provided for by applicable law, rule, or regulation, including but not limited to the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA).

6. TERMINATION

Either party may terminate this Agreement, upon sixty (60) days written notice. In the event that either party terminates this Agreement with or without cause, such termination of the Agreement shall not discharge the parties’ existing obligations to each other as of the effective date of termination.

7. GENERAL TERMS

- 7.1 **Governing Law.** This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the state of New York. In the event that any proceeding of a judicial nature is brought to determine any matter arising out of, or in connection with, this Agreement, the proceeding shall be brought in a court of competent jurisdiction in the state of New York.
- 7.2 The heading of the various section of this Agreement are inserted only for convenience of reference and are not intended, nor shall they be construed to modify, define, limit, or expand the intent of the parties as expressed in this Agreement.
- 7.3 **Severability.** In the event any provision of this Agreement shall be held to be invalid or unenforceable, the remaining provision of this Agreement shall nevertheless remain in full force and effect.

- 7.4 Interpretation. When the context in which the words are used in this Agreement indicates that such is the intent, the words in the singular number shall include the plural and vice versa, and words in the masculine gender shall include feminine and neuter genders and vice versa.
- 7.5 Successors. This Agreement shall be binding upon the parties hereto, and their successors.
- 7.6 Notices. Whenever under this Agreement one party is required or permitted to give notice to the other, such notice shall be in writing and shall be deemed given upon earliest of (a) delivery or (b) five business days after such notice is mailed by registered or certified United States mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid, and addressed to the addressee at the address set forth in this Agreement.
- 7.7 Amendments and Waivers. This Agreement may not be modified, amended, extended or augmented without prior written consent of RCS and the District. The failure of either party to enforce any provision of this Agreement shall not be construed as a waiver or limitation of that party's right to subsequently enforce every provision of this Agreement.
- 7.8 Relationship between the Parties. The District, its employees, agents and subcontractors performing under this Agreement are not employees or agents of RCS. Neither RCS nor the District employees shall hold themselves out or claim to be employees of the other. RCS and its employees shall be solely responsible for the payment of federal and state income taxes applicable to this agreement.
- 7.9 Neither RCS nor any of its employees or agents will be eligible for any employee benefits whatsoever relative to this contract including, but not limited to, Social Security, New York State Worker's Compensation, unemployment insurance, New York State Employees Retirement System, health or dental insurance, or malpractice insurance, or the like.
- 7.10 It is expressly understood that this Agreement shall not be assigned or transferred without prior written consent of the other party.

8. LIABILITY

- 8.1 RCS is relying upon the District to provide accurate student and staff information and all other data as set forth herein to be supplied by the District. RCS shall not be liable for any damages or losses incurred by District of any kind, or nature, including but not limited to a payback for monies paid to the District; if the information supplied by the District to RCS was incomplete or erroneous in any way.
- 8.2 RCS agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the District, its officers, directors, agents or employees against all claims, demands, actions, lawsuits, costs, damages and expenses including attorneys' fees, judgments, fines and amounts arising from any willful act, omission, error, recklessness or negligence of RCS, its officers, directors, agents or employees in connection with the performance of services pursuant to this agreement. The obligations pursuant to this provision shall survive the termination of this agreement.

9. CONFIDENTIAL DISCLOSURE OF MEDICAID FRAUD

RCS is aware that its practices and the acts of its employees relating to Medicaid Billing, data collection, Medicaid payments, and all of the services listed in Section 3 of the Contract may be

confidentially reported by an employee of the South Country School District to the New York State Medicaid Compliance Officer, if the employee believes such practices is inappropriate. RCS shall participate with state agencies and the school district to determine the credibility of the allegation and the existence of a Medicaid violation. If a violation is found attributable in whole or part to an action or practice taken by RCS or its employees, RCS shall work with the state agencies and the District to remedy the violation and its effects. RCS shall cooperate with the District's efforts to write a remedial plan for correcting the violations. The training RCS provides to the District's staff and other school district employees pursuant to Section 3 .10 of this Agreement shall include information regarding the Confidential Disclosure Policy, the contact information of the New York Compliance Officer, and an assurance that no employee will face retaliation for reporting Medicaid abuse and fraud.

10. POSSIBILITY OF MEDICAID COMPLIANCE PROGRAM

If during the duration of this Agreement the Board decides, pursuant to New York Social Services Law§ 363-d, to develop and implement a Medicaid compliance program to detect fraud, waste, and abuse, RCS will cooperate with the District's efforts to protect the integrity of the school district's Medicaid billing practices, provided both parties agree in writing and the District gives RCS thirty (30) days written notice of its desire to discuss such a change in this Agreement

11. NOTICES

Any notices to be given under this Agreement by either party to the other may be effected by personal delivery in writing or by mail, registered or certified, postage prepaid with return receipt requested. Each party may change the address by written notice in accordance with this paragraph. Notices delivered personally will be deemed communicated as of actual receipt; mailed notices will be deemed communicated as of two (2) days after mailing. Notice shall be delivered or mailed to:

A. TERM

The term of this Agreement shall be from July 1, 2014 through June 30, 2015 inclusive, unless terminated early as provided for in this Agreement. It is understood that the DISTRICT is under no obligation to renew this Agreement upon its expiration.

B. SERVICES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

1. During the term of this Agreement, CONSULTANT shall provide those professional staff and services listed in the attached Fee Schedule, incorporated by reference herein and made a part of this Agreement, to the DISTRICT, as needed, and in accordance with the terms of this Agreement.
2. The CONSULTANT shall provide the services set forth in this Agreement to those student(s) referred by the DISTRICT in writing.
3. All services provided by CONSULTANT to students under this Agreement shall be in accordance with each student's Individualized Education Plan (IEP), as it may be modified from time to time. Prompt written notice shall be given by the DISTRICT to the CONSULTANT upon any modification of a student's IEP. The DISTRICT shall obtain whatever releases, prescriptions or other legal documents are necessary for the CONSULTANT to perform its services pursuant to this Agreement.



WHEREAS, the DISTRICT is authorized under the Education Law to contract with private, non-residential schools within the State of New York for the instruction of students with disabilities in those situations where the DISTRICT is unable to provide for the education of such students with disabilities in special classes in the schools of the DISTRICT; and

WHEREAS, the SCHOOL is a private, non-residential school within the State of New York authorized to provide special education and related services to students with disabilities, and identified under Article 85 of the Education Law (§4201 et seq.).

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties mutually agree as follows:

A. TERM

The term of this Agreement shall be from July 1, 2014 through June 30, 2015 inclusive, unless terminated early as provided for in this Agreement. It is understood that the DISTRICT is under no obligation to renew this Agreement upon its expiration.

B. SERVICES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

1. During the term of this Agreement, the services to be provided by the SCHOOL shall include, but not be limited to the following:
 - Instructional Services
 - Special Education and Related Services as set forth in each student's Individualized Education Plan (IEP).
2. The SCHOOL shall provide the services set forth in this Agreement to those student(s) referred by the DISTRICT in writing.
3. All services provided by the SCHOOL to students under this Agreement shall be in accordance with each student's Individualized Education Program (IEP), as it may be modified from time to time. Prompt written notice shall be given by the DISTRICT to the SCHOOL upon any modification of a student's IEP.

4. The SCHOOL shall perform all services under this Agreement in accordance with all applicable Federal, State and local laws, rules, and regulations, as well as established policy guidance from the New York State Education Department.
5. The SCHOOL shall comply with all applicable provisions of the Safe Schools Against Violence in Education (SAVE) Act.
6. The SCHOOL represents that services under this Agreement shall be provided by qualified individuals of good character and in good professional standing. The SCHOOL represents that no individuals providing services under this Agreement are currently charged, nor in the past have been charged with any relevant criminal or professional misconduct or incompetence.
7. Upon the execution of this Agreement, the SCHOOL shall provide copies of required licenses/certifications of all professionals providing services to student(s) under this Agreement. In the event that the required license/certification of any agent or employee of the SCHOOL providing services under this Agreement is revoked, terminated, suspended, or otherwise impaired, the SCHOOL shall immediately notify the DISTRICT in accordance with the requirements for all notices pursuant to this Agreement set forth below.
8. The SCHOOL shall maintain its status as an approved special education provider. In the event that the SCHOOL fails to maintain such status, the SCHOOL shall immediately notify the DISTRICT. The DISTRICT shall not be required to pay the SCHOOL for services rendered during any period of time in which the SCHOOL fails to maintain its status as an approved special education provider, and the SCHOOL shall reimburse the DISTRICT for any payments already received for services rendered during said period of time.
9. The SCHOOL shall provide all services pursuant to this Agreement in a competent, professional and timely manner.
10. The SCHOOL will work cooperatively with the DISTRICT's Committee on Special Education (CSE) and Committee on Pre-School Special Education (CPSE). The SCHOOL shall make relevant personnel available to participate in meetings of the DISTRICT's Committee on Special Education (CSE), where appropriate, upon reasonable prior notice to the SCHOOL of such meetings.
11. The SCHOOL shall maintain records, logs and/or reports in accordance with all applicable laws, regulations, and requirements of the New York State Education Department or Health Department. The DISTRICT shall have the right to examine any or all records or accounts maintained and/or created by the SCHOOL in connection with this Agreement, and upon request shall be entitled to copies of same.
12. Both parties to this Agreement understand that they may receive and/or come into contact with protected health information as defined by the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA). The parties hereby

acknowledge their respective responsibilities pursuant to HIPAA and shall comply with said Regulations, if applicable.

13. Both parties, their employees, and/or agents agree that all information obtained in connection with the services performed pursuant to this Agreement is deemed confidential information. Both parties, their employees, and/or agents shall not use, publish, discuss, disclose or communicate the contents of such information, directly or indirectly with third parties, except as provided for in this Agreement. Both parties further agree that any information received by either party's employees and/or agents in connection with this Agreement which concerns the personal, financial, or other affairs of the parties, their employees, agents, and/or students will be treated as confidential and will not be revealed to any other persons, firms, organizations, or third parties. In addition, both parties agree that information concerning any student covered by the terms of this Agreement shall not be released except as provided for by applicable law, rule, or regulation, including but not limited to the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA).
14. The DISTRICT shall obtain whatever releases, prescriptions, or other legal documents that are necessary for the SCHOOL to provide services pursuant to this Agreement.
15. The DISTRICT shall obtain releases or other legal documents necessary for the SCHOOL to render full reports concerning the education and progress of the student(s) to the DISTRICT at the same time that such reports are made to the parent(s) of student(s) covered by the terms of this Agreement.
16. Upon reasonable prior notice, the SCHOOL shall be subject to visitation by the DISTRICT and/or its designated representatives during the normal business hours of the SCHOOL.
17. In the event that the parent or person in parental relation to a student(s) receiving services pursuant to this Agreement files a request for an impartial hearing or administrative complaint or initiates litigation in connection with such services, the SCHOOL shall promptly give written notice of same to the DISTRICT.
18. Insurance
 - a. The SCHOOL, at its sole expense, shall procure and maintain such policies of commercial general liability, malpractice and other insurance as shall be necessary to insure the SCHOOL and the DISTRICT, including the Board of Education, employees and volunteers, as additional insured, against any claim for liability, personal injury, or death occasioned directly or indirectly by the SCHOOL in connection with the performance of the SCHOOL'S responsibilities under this Agreement; each such policy shall provide a minimum coverage of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) per occurrence subject to an annual aggregate of Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000).

- b. The insurance is to be underwritten by a licensed and/or admitted New York State Insurer with a minimum Bests rating of A-minus.
- c. In the event any of the aforementioned insurance policies are cancelled or not renewed, the SCHOOL shall notify the DISTRICT in writing within thirty (30) days of such cancellation or non-renewal.
- d. Upon the execution of this Agreement, the SCHOOL will supply the DISTRICT with a Certificate of Insurance including the DISTRICT, Board of Education, Employees and Volunteers as Additional Insured, a copy of the Declaration pages of the policies, and a copy of the additional insured endorsement.

C. COMPENSATION:

1. The SCHOOL shall be entitled to recover tuition from the DISTRICT for each student receiving services pursuant to this Agreement in accordance with the tuition rate established by the Commissioner of Education.
2. Requests for payment by the SCHOOL shall be made by submission of a detailed written invoice to the DISTRICT which references the time period for which payment is being requested and a breakdown of the total amount due for the period specified.
3. The DISTRICT shall pay the SCHOOL within thirty (30) days of receipt of each invoice by the DISTRICT.
4. The DISTRICT shall give the SCHOOL notice of any invoice disputes within twenty (20) days of its receipt of the invoice, and reserves the right to withhold payment pending the resolution of the dispute.

D. MISCELLANEOUS

1. Termination

- a. Either the DISTRICT or the SCHOOL may terminate this Agreement upon thirty (30) days prior written notice to the other party. Such notice shall be given in accordance with the requirements for all notices pursuant to this Agreement set forth below.
- b. The parties agree that either party's failure to comply with any terms or conditions of this Agreement will provide a basis for the other party to immediately terminate this Agreement without any further liability to the party which violated the Agreement.
- c. In the event the DISTRICT or the SCHOOL terminates this Agreement with or without cause, such termination of the Agreement shall not

discharge the parties' existing obligations to each other as of the effective date of termination.

2. Defense / Indemnification

- a. The SCHOOL agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the DISTRICT, its officers, directors, agents, or employees against all claims, demands, actions, lawsuits, costs, damages and expenses, including attorneys' fees, judgments, fines and amounts arising from any willful act, omission, error, recklessness or negligence of the SCHOOL, its officers, directors, agents or employees in connection with the performance of services pursuant to this Agreement. The obligations pursuant to this provision shall survive the termination of this Agreement.
- b. The DISTRICT agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the SCHOOL, its officers, directors, agents, or employees against all claims, demands, actions, lawsuits, costs, damages and expenses, including attorneys' fees, judgments, fines and amounts arising from any willful act, omission, error, recklessness or negligence of the DISTRICT, its officers, directors, agents or employees in connection with the performance of services pursuant to this Agreement. The obligations pursuant to this provision shall survive the termination of this Agreement.

3. All notices which are required or permitted under this Agreement shall be in writing, and shall be deemed to have been given if delivered personally or sent by registered or certified mail, addressed as follows:

- 4. It is expressly understood that this Agreement shall not be assigned or transferred without the prior written consent of the other party.
- 5. The failure of either party to enforce any provision of this Agreement shall not be construed as a waiver or limitation of that party's right to subsequently enforce every provision of this Agreement.
- 6. Should any provision of this Agreement, for any reason, be declared invalid and/or unenforceable, such decision shall not effect the validity of the remaining provisions of this Agreement. Such remaining provisions shall remain in full force and effect as if this Agreement had been executed with the invalid provision(s) eliminated.

7. This Agreement and the rights and obligations of the parties hereunder shall be construed in accordance with, and governed by, the laws and regulations of the State of New York and applicable Federal laws and regulations. Any dispute arising under this Agreement shall be litigated in the Courts of Suffolk County, New York.
8. This Agreement is the complete and exclusive statement of the Agreement between the parties, and supersedes all prior or contemporaneous, oral or written: agreements, proposals, understandings, representations, conditions or covenants between the parties relating to the subject matter of the Agreement.
9. This Agreement may not be changed orally, but only by an agreement, in writing, signed by authorized representatives of both parties.
10. This Agreement, and any amendments to this Agreement, will not be in effect until agreed to in writing and signed by authorized representatives of both parties.

CONTRACT FOR WEBSITE SERVICES

Agreement, made this ____ day of _____ 2014, by and between the South Country Central School District, having an administrative office at 189 Dunton Avenue, East Patchogue, NY 11772, hereinafter referred to alternately as a "Party" or as SOUTH COUNTRY; and Watermoor Group Limited d/b/a Syntax Communication, having an office at 2410 North Ocean Avenue, Suite 400, Farmingville, NY 11738, hereinafter referred to alternately as a "Party" or as SYNTAX. SOUTH COUNTRY and SYNTAX shall collectively be referred to as the "Parties."

WITNESSETH:

1. **Services.** SOUTH COUNTRY hereby retains SYNTAX to provide the following annual website maintenance and hosting services:

- Unlimited updates, additions and revision to district website (as requested by phone or email).
- Emergency updates to website as needed.
- Website training and consultation (via phone, web conferencing or on-site).
- Ongoing technical support/troubleshooting.
- Non-programming technical solutions as required.
- Ongoing programmed upgrades to Website Management System (WMS) for system performance, new features.
- Proactive approach to website, ensuring content and functionality remains up-to-date.
- Hosting of district website on virtual private server; includes data protection and cloud backup server, 1500GB Enterprise backup server, managed firewalls for all servers and IP address management.

2. **Compensation.** For services rendered as outlined above, SOUTH COUNTRY shall pay to SYNTAX the sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00). This fee is comprised of website maintenance in the amount of \$2,250.00; and webhosting, which is fully eligible for e-rate, in the amount of \$2,750.00. The fee shall be billed by SYNTAX in one lump sum on July 1, 2014. Compensation shall be made by SOUTH COUNTRY to SYNTAX in accordance with SYNTAX's payment terms of net thirty (30) days from date of invoice.

3. **Term.** The term of this contract shall be for the period of July 1, 2014 through June 30, 2015. Said term may be extended thereafter by mutual written agreement. When the term expires or services are terminated, all access to the website hosting services will cease and all information and content contained therein will be deleted after 30 days. Syntax accepts no responsibility for such deleted information or content.

4. **Termination.** SOUTH COUNTRY may terminate this agreement for any reason upon ten (10) days' written notice to SYNTAX. In the event this Agreement is terminated, SOUTH COUNTRY shall be entitled to a pro rata refund of the annual fee. 



Hi Gail,
This is a frequent question, since the technology has changed and you rarely see VHS players anymore. As you are aware, schools (and even BOCES) have been sued for creating copies of VHS tapes without proper licensing or permissions. I first want to send you the link, for you and your member districts, to review on this very subject from [copyright.gov](http://www.copyright.gov) (Section 108): 108 . Limitations on exclusive rights: Reproduction by libraries and archives
<http://www.copyright.gov/title17/92chap1.html#108>

In this case, Fair Use does not apply, so we relay the following requirements:

- 1) The school, district or region should have a license that specifically allows or provides duplication rights for each VHS tape.
- 2) That there is not a DVD available for the publisher to have commercial gain.

Even though there are multiple providers, we recommend contacting the publisher and ask for permission to create "1" DVD copy. You might be surprised at the number of permissions granted. By going this route, the school entity should receive written permission for the one-time duplication.

Hopefully, your member districts will recognize you have their best interest at heart and that if they go the non-permission route, it could be very costly. I was with Richard Dolph a couple of months ago visiting some of the upstate BOCES and they were going through this same process (the legal route ☺).

I hope this helps and please let us know if there any additional questions.



RESOLVED, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, the Board of Education approves the Bellport Methodist Church proposal with respect to the provision of Universal Pre- Kindergarten services for the 2014-2015 school year to a maximum of 32 students in an amount not to exceed \$62,400, calculated at a per pupil rate of \$1,950.00 per enrolled student.

FURTHER RESOLVED, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, the Board of Education approves the contract with Bellport Methodist Church with respect to the provision of Universal Pre-Kindergarten services for the 2014-2015 school year and authorizes the President of said Board to execute the same on behalf of the District.

BACKGROUND RATIONALE: Bellport United Methodist has been a universal pre-kindergarten provider for the district in past years, as well as the current year. An extensive on-site review of the program was conducted this past year to assess coordination with the district's in-house UPK program.
