MANDATORY STATE EDUCATION DEPT. FIELD TESTING

WHEREAS, mandatory New York State assessment tests in ELA and math are given to New York students in grades 3 through 8 during April of each school year which is the beginning of the fourth quarter of the school year. The South Country Central School District Board of Education believes this timing is dictated by the needs of the State Education Department teachers' and principals' accountability system, known as APPR;

WHEREAS, the Board of Education believes the quality of instruction of all students in grades 3-8 grade is lowered by mandatory testing practices of the State Education Department resulting in the reduction of students' learning opportunities;

WHEREAS, these mandatory tests are developed, in part, through the administration of additional "field tests" used by testing companies to develop appropriate questions for future tests;

WHEREAS, the Board of Education believes the testing companies realize a commercial profit by using children and taxpayer resources to advance their business plans;

WHEREAS, in the past, a district's participation in these "field tests" was on a voluntary basis;

WHEREAS, the State Education Department has proposed amending certain Regulations of the Commissioner of Education such that New York school districts would be required to administer the "field tests". The Board of Education believes this will result in the use of more instructional time for the purpose of advancing a mandatory testing system organized and based, in part, on APPR, not on the basis of what is best for children;

WHEREAS, the Regents are considering the proposal of the State Education Department to make the administration of these "field tests" mandatory;

WHEREAS, the Board of Education believes additional mandatory testing will force children and districts to, in effect, subsidize the profit-making work of testing companies thus using public resources and private families for the purpose of advancing a private business plan.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the South Country Central School District Board of Education disagrees strongly with any additional mandatory testing and urges the Regents to reject the State Education Department's proposal to make "field tests" mandatory and to reconsider its approach to assessing student learning and teacher and/or principal effectiveness. The Board of Education believes that a decision to increase mandatory testing would hurt children and abuse the public trust by subsidizing private enterprise without public discussion.





SERVICE AGREEMENT 4201 SCHOOL

THIS AGREEMENT made this 1st day of September, 2014 by and between BOARD OF EDUCATION, SOUTH COUNTRY CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT, (hereinafter referred to as the "SCHOOL DISTRICT"), having its principal place of business located at 189 Dunton Avenue, East Patchogue, NY 11772 and the 4201 school, HENRY VISCARDI SCHOOL, hereinafter referred to as the "SERVICE PROVIDER" having its principal place of business for purposes of this Agreement at 201 I.U. Willets Road, Albertson, NY 11507.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, School Districts are authorized by law to contract with institutions within the State of New York for the instruction of disabled children in those situations where the School District is unable to provide for the education of certain or all disabled children in classes in the public schools; and

WHEREAS, SERVICE PROVIDER is a school chartered by the Board of Regents of the University of the State of New York pursuant to § 4201 of the New York State Education Law and as such is authorized to establish, conduct, operate and maintain an educational program for severely physically disabled students; and

WHEREAS, the School District desires that SERVICE PROVIDER provide instruction to the students enrolled in the program(s) operated by SERVICE PROVIDER; and

WHEREAS, SERVICE PROVIDER warrants that it has reviewed the individualized education program ("IEP") of each pupil to be enrolled in its program(s), and represents that it will provide the level of services identified in the IEP to meet the needs of such children; and

WHEREAS, SERVICE PROVIDER is capable of and willing to provide the within services in accordance with the students' IEPs to the School District.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants contained in this Agreement, the parties hereto mutually agree as follows:

1. <u>TERM OF AGREEMENT</u>: This Agreement shall be in effect for the period September 1, 2014 to June 30, 2015 unless terminated earlier, as set forth herein.

2. SCOPE OF SERVICES:

SERVICE PROVIDER shall provide adequate instruction, related services and/or a facility to students listed in Appendix A during the school year. The education provided by SERVICE PROVIDER shall be appropriate to the mental ability and physical condition of the children, and

in accordance with Commissioner's Regulations, all applicable Federal, State and local statutes, rules and ordinances. SERVICE PROVIDER agrees to provide services in accordance with the State Education Department's regulations, using only professionals/service providers certified by the New York State Education Department. All services shall be provided in strict compliance with the student's IEP. SERVICE PROVIDER further agrees that all disciplinary measures for disabled students will be conducted in accordance with applicable Federal, State and local laws, rules and regulations.

SERVICE PROVIDER shall provide the following services, consisting of, but not limited to, the following:

- i. Services based on individual student IEPs;
- ii. The implementation of goals and objectives for the educational services provided as per each individual student's IEP;
- iii. The completion of progress reports regarding student achievement of objectives as per report card schedules;
- iv. Provide the SCHOOL DISTRICT Committee on Special Education (CSE) with annual progress reports for each individual student receiving services;
- v. Complete evaluations as per the request of the SCHOOL DISTRICT'S Director of Special Education and upon agreement of the SERVICE PROVIDER, on an as needed basis and in accordance with SERVICE PROVIDER'S payment policy.
- vi. Comply with any testing requirements upon notification of such review dates.

3. PAYMENT SCHEDULE:

- a. In full consideration for the educational services to be rendered by SERVICE PROVIDER to the School District for the period of this Agreement, the School District will pay to SERVICE PROVIDER, for each child, a per pupil charge (PPC) set by the Commissioner of the New York State Education Department. If the PPC for this school year is not available at the beginning of this school year, the SCHOOL DISTRICT shall pay the PPC applicable to the previous school year until new PPC is set, at which time the parties shall adjust future tuition payments so that SERVICE PROVIDER will be paid in accordance with the rates applicable to that current school year. The SCHOOL DISTRICT shall retroactively pay SERVICE PROVIDER any underpayment for that current school year in accordance with the new PPC or any overpayments will be relimbursed by SERVICE PROVIDER to the SCHOOL DISTRICT for that current school year.
- b. SCHOOL DISTRICT shall be responsible for payment of the tuition as provided for in this Agreement as long as the child is enrolled in SERVICE PROVIDER's program(s) or until such time as the student is withdrawn from such program(s) in accordance with the termination provision herein. In the event of such termination, payment shall be prorated from the time services were provided to the student.
- 4. INVOICE DUE ON MONTHLY BASIS: SERVICE PROVIDER will submit an invoice for services rendered on a monthly basis, and payment to SERVICE PROVIDER shall be made within thirty (30) days from receipt of invoice from SERVICE PROVIDER. The invoice shall include time sheets and attendance, types of services rendered and fees payable and individuals who received services. Students shall be assigned an identification number which shall be used in the place of student names for billing purposes. SCHOOL DISTRICT shall give SERVICE PROVIDER notice of any invoice dispute within twenty (20) days of receipt of the invoice.

No parent or guardian shall be required to make any payment for services on behalf of any child covered by this Agreement. SERVICE PROVIDER and its employees shall not share or accept any fee or gratuity from the student or student's family for services provided pursuant to this Agreement.

- 5. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR: All employees of SERVICE PROVIDER shall be deemed employees of SERVICE PROVIDER for all purposes and SERVICE PROVIDER alone shall be responsible for their work, personal conduct, direction, and compensation. SERVICE PROVIDER acknowledges that it will not hold itself, its officers, employees and/ or agents out as employees of SCHOOL DISTRICT. SERVICE PROVIDER is retained by SCHOOL DISTRICT only for the purposes and to the extent set forth in this Agreement, and its relationship to SCHOOL DISTRICT shall, during the periods of its services hereunder, be that of an independent contractor. Employees of SERVICE PROVIDER shall not be considered as having employee status and shall not be entitled to participate in any of SCHOOL DISTRICT's workers' compensation, retirement, fringe benefits, unemployment insurance, liability insurance, disability insurance, or other similar employee benefit programs.
- 6. EXPENSES OF SERVICE PROVIDER: SERVICE PROVIDER shall be responsible for all costs and expenses incurred by SERVICE PROVIDER that are incident to the performance of services for SCHOOL DISTRICT, including, but not limited to, all tools, vehicles, or other equipment to be provided by SERVICE PROVIDER, all fees, fines, licenses, bonds or taxes required of or imposed against SERVICE PROVIDER. SCHOOL DISTRICT shall not be responsible for any expenses incurred by SERVICE PROVIDER in performing services for SCHOOL DISTRICT.
- 7. INCOME TAX DESIGNATION AND INDEMNIFICATION: SCHOOL DISTRICT shall not withhold from sums payable to SERVICE PROVIDER under this Agreement any amounts for Federal, State, or local taxes including Federal or State income taxes, employment taxes (including Social Security and Medicare taxes), and unemployment taxes. SERVICE PROVIDER agrees that any tax obligation of SERVICE PROVIDER arising from the payments made under this Agreement will be SERVICE PROVIDER's sole responsibility.
- 8. <u>SCHOOL DISTRICT'S RIGHT TO EXAMINE ACCOUNTING RECORDS</u>: SCHOOL DISTRICT shall have the right to examine any and all accounting records as they pertain to SCHOOL DISTRICT students placed with SERVICE PROVIDER. For purposes of this Agreement, the definition and calculation of enrollment and attendance shall be determined by SCHOOL DISTRICT, in accordance with New York State Education Law § 4201 and pursuant to each student's appointment by the Commissioner of Education.
- 9. LICENSE AND AUTHORIZATION: SERVICE PROVIDER warrants that it is duly authorized to perform the services as described herein. SERVICE PROVIDER warrants that it will provide SCHOOL DISTRICT with licensed and qualified individuals. SERVICE PROVIDER further represents that such services shall be performed by individuals that are licensed under the laws of the State of New York, inclusive of the State Education Department Licensing requirements or by persons otherwise qualified to provide services in accordance with all applicable laws and regulations. SERVICE PROVIDER shall certify that all such individuals possess documentation evidencing such license or other qualifications as required by Federal, State or local statutes, rules, regulations and orders. Where applicable, SERVICE PROVIDER agrees to submit to SCHOOL DISTRICT, upon request, proof of certification and/ or professional licensing of all individuals providing services to Medicaid eligible school aged students, 5-21 years old, classified with a disability or suspected of having a disability for Medicaid reimbursement

purposes. SERVICE PROVIDER further agrees to complete and submit, upon the request of SCHOOL DISTRICT, all forms to document the evaluation and services provided to Medicaid eligible school aged students, 5-21 years old, classified with a disability or suspected of having a disability for Medicaid reimbursement purposes.

- 10. <u>SAVE LEGISLATION:</u> SERVICE PROVIDER understands and agrees that it is responsible for complying with all applicable Federal, State, local statutes, rules, and ordinances including the New York State Safe Schools Against Violence in Education (SAVE) legislation. SERVICE PROVIDER shall adhere to all applicable requirements and protocols as established by SCHOOL DISTRICT and the State Education Department of New York including, without limitation, fingerprinting. Upon request, SERVICE PROVIDER must submit to the SCHOOL DISTRICT verification regarding such providers' clearance status.
- 11. <u>ATTENDANCE RECORDS</u>: SERVICE PROVIDER shall maintain monthly attendance records which shall be submitted to SCHOOL DISTRICT at the end of each month upon request.
- 12. <u>REPORTS OF STUDENTS:</u> SERVICE PROVIDER will make every effort to obtain releases or other legal documents that are necessary in order that SERVICE PROVIDER may render full and complete reports concerning the education and progress of the pupil(s) covered by the terms of this Agreement.
- 13. <u>REPORTS TO STATE</u>: SERVICE PROVIDER hereby agrees to furnish to the State all reports, audits, etc. required to make determinations as to eligibility under the provisions of the Regulations of the Commissioner of Education. Such materials shall be furnished at such times as are required by the State. SERVICE PROVIDER agrees to provide the State access to all relevant records which the State requires to determine SERVICE PROVIDER's compliance with applicable Federal or State statutes or regulations with the effect of law, which regulate either the execution of the Agreement or the performance of obligations under the Agreement. SERVICE PROVIDER agrees to retain all materials and records relevant to the execution or performance of the Agreement in accordance with law.
- 14. <u>REPORTS TO SCHOOL DISTRICT</u>: SERVICE PROVIDER hereby agrees to furnish written reports of each pupil's educational progress to SCHOOL DISTRICT. SERVICE PROVIDER will render such reports to SCHOOL DISTRICT at any time that such reports are made to the parents of the pupil(s) covered by the terms of this Agreement Upon request, reports shall be furnished upon termination of the Agreement. SERVICE PROVIDER shall provide such additional information concerning the pupil's progress as may be reasonably required by SCHOOL DISTRICT.
- 15. <u>STATE AUDITS</u>: SERVICE PROVIDER shall cooperate with the State and its Agents and provide all information to them as may be required for the State and its Agents to fulfill their auditing or other legal responsibilities.
- 16. <u>AUTHORIZATION OF SCHOOL DISTRICT</u>: SERVICE PROVIDER shall coordinate all instruction through the Pupil Personnel Services Office or any other authorized office of SCHOOL DISTRICT.
- 17. <u>STUDENT REMOVAL</u>: SCHOOL DISTRICT reserves the right to add, subject to SERVICE PROVIDER'S approval, or remove a child from the list of the children covered by this

Agreement at any time during the year in accordance with the students' IEP and all applicable Federal and State laws and regulations. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary herein, in the event a student's continued presence poses a danger to the health or safety or that student or others, the SERVICE PROVIDER may remove the student from the educational setting as in accordance with law. Payment for children added or removed shall be prorated for the period of time services were provided to the child. All appropriate statutory and regulatory notifications will be made by the SCHOOL DISTRICT including but not limited to SED.

- 18. <u>NON-SOLICITATION CLAUSE</u>: For the period of this Agreement and for one year after the termination of this Agreement the SCHOOL DISTRICT shall not hire or solicit for employment an employee of SERVICE PROVIDER who was employed by SERVICE PROVIDER or who provides or provided services to a student residing within the SCHOOL DISTRICT without the express written consent SERVICE PROVIDER's Chief Operating Officer.
- 19. <u>TERMINATION NOTICE</u>: This Agreement may be terminated by either party upon thirty (30) days written notice to the other party but in compliance with the students' IEP's and in accordance with all applicable Federal and State laws and regulations.
- 20. <u>CONFIDENTIALITY:</u> SERVICE PROVIDER agrees that information received by SERVICE PROVIDER, its employees, and/ or agents during the course of the services provided pursuant to this Agreement which concerns the personal, financial, or other affairs of SCHOOL DISTRICT, its employees, agents, clients, and/ or students will be treated by SERVICE PROVIDER, its employees, and/or agents in full confidence and will not be revealed to any other persons, firms, or organizations except as in accordance with law.
- 21. <u>HIPAA</u>: Both parties to this Agreement understand that they may receive and/ or come into contact with *protected health information* as defined by the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA). The Parties hereby acknowledge their respective responsibilities pursuant to HIPAA and, if necessary, shall execute a Business Associate Agreement in connection with such responsibilities.
- 22. <u>INDEMNIFICATION and HOLD HARMLESS PROVISION</u>: SERVICE PROVIDER agrees that it shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless SCHOOL DISTRICT, its officers, directors, agents and employees for all loss, costs, damages and expenses, including attorneys' fees, judgments, fines and amounts paid in settlement in connection with a terminated, pending or completed action, suit or proceeding arising from any act, error or omission, misstatement, misleading statement, neglect or breach of duties by SERVICE PROVIDER or any of its officers, directors, agents or employees taken or made with respect to this Agreement.

SCHOOL DISTRICT agrees that it shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless SERVICE PROVIDER, its officers, directors, agents and employees for all loss, costs, damages and expenses, including attorneys' fees, judgments, fines and amounts paid in settlement in connection with a terminated, pending or completed action, suit or proceeding arising from any act, error or omission, misstatement, misleading statement, neglect or breach of duties by SCHOOL DISTRICT or any of its officers, directors, agents or employees taken or made with respect to this Agreement.

23. <u>INSURANCE PROVISION</u>: SERVICE PROVIDER shall purchase from and maintain in a company or companies lawfully licensed to do business in the State of New York such insurance as will protect SERVICE PROVIDER and SCHOOL DISTRICT from claims set forth below for which SERVICE PROVIDER may be legally liable, whether such operations be by

SERVICE PROVIDER or by anyone directly or indirectly employed by any of them, or by anyone for whose acts any of them may be liable. Notwithstanding any terms, conditions or provisions in any other writing between the parties, SERVICE PROVIDER hereby agrees to effectuate the naming of SCHOOL DISTRICT as an additional insured on SERVICE PROVIDER's insurance policies, with the exception of workers' compensation and professional liability.

24. <u>NOTICES</u>: Any notices to be given under this Agreement by either party to the other may be effected by personal delivery in writing or by mail, registered or certified, postage prepaid with return receipt requested. Each party may change the address by written notice in accordance with this paragraph. Notices delivered personally will be deemed communicated as of actual receipt; mailed notices will be deemed communicated as of two (2) days after mailing.

- 25. <u>ASSIGNMENT OF CONTRACT</u>: SERVICE PROVIDER shall not assign, transfer or convey any of its respective rights or obligations under this Agreement without the prior written consent of SCHOOL DISTRICT and, as applicable, SED.
- 26. <u>DISCRIMINATION</u>: Services provided pursuant to this Agreement shall be provided without regard to race, creed, color, sex, sexual orientation, national origin, religion, age or disability.
- 27. <u>GOVERNING LAW</u>: This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of New York and applicable Federal laws and regulations. Each of the parties agrees to submit to the jurisdiction of the courts of the State of New York, County of Nassau, or the Federal court otherwise having jurisdiction.
- 28. <u>SEVERABILITY</u>: If any term, provision, covenant or condition of this Agreement, or the application thereof to any person, place or circumstance, shall be held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, unenforceable or void, the remainder of this Agreement and such term, provision, covenant or condition as applied to other persons, places and circumstances, shall remain in full force and effect.
- 29. <u>NO PRIOR AGREEMENTS</u>: This Agreement constitutes the full and complete Agreement between SCHOOL DISTRICT and SERVICE PROVIDER, and supersedes all prior written and oral agreements, commitments or understandings with respect thereto. This Agreement may not be altered, changed, added to, deleted from or modified except through the mutual written consent of the parties.
- 30. <u>AGREEMENT CONSTRUCTION</u>: This Agreement has been arrived at mutually and is not to be construed against any party hereto as being the drafter hereof or causing the same to be drafted.
- 31. <u>REPRESENTATIONS AND WARRANTIES</u>: SERVICE PROVIDER represents and warrants: 1) that SERVICE PROVIDER has no obligations, legal or otherwise, inconsistent with the terms of this Agreement; 2) that the performance of the services to be provided in this

Agreement does not and will not violate any applicable law, rule or regulation or any proprietary or other right of any third party; and 3) that SERVICE PROVIDER has not entered into or will not enter into any Agreement (whether oral or written) in conflict with this Agreement.

- 32. AMENDMENT: This Agreement may be amended only in writing and signed by the parties.
- 33. <u>NONWAIVER</u>: No action or failure to act by SERVICE PROVIDER or SCHOOL DISTRICT shall constitute a waiver of a right or duty afforded them under the Agreement, nor shall such action or failure to act constitute approval of or acquiescence in a breach thereunder, except as may be specifically agreed in writing.
- 34. <u>AUTHORITY TO ENTER AGREEMENT</u>: Each party represents and warrants to the other party that this Agreement has been duly authorized, executed and delivered and that the performance of its obligations under this Agreement do not conflict with any order, law, rule or regulation or any agreement or understanding by which such party is bound.
- 35. <u>Conflicts of Interest:</u> Each party represents that there are no conflicts of interest between each other or that would otherwise limit either party's participation in this Agreement.
- 36. Execution: This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, all of which shall be considered one and the same document as if all parties had executed a single original document. This Agreement may be executed by facsimile copy and each signature thereto shall be and constitute an original signature, as if all parties had executed a single original document.
- 37. <u>Survival of Terms</u>: All provisions of this Agreement that would reasonably be expected to survive the termination of this Agreement shall do so.
- 38. Retention of Rights: The parties shall each retain all their rights at law and in equity in the event of a material breach of the Agreement by the other party.

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT made this _____ day of December, 2014 by and between the Board of Education of the South Country Central School District (hereinafter "Board" or "District"), and the Bellport Teachers' Association (hereinafter "BTA") is constituted as follows:

WHEREAS, the District and the BTA are parties to a Collective Bargaining Agreement ("CBA") with a term of July 1, 2008 through June 30, 2015; and

WHEREAS, on or around April 4, 2014 the District posted the position of Elementary Science Organizer at a stipended rate of \$5,500.00 per annum, prorated to be paid in connection with the District's award of the STLE Grant; and

WHEREAS, as part of said position the incumbent was to 1) provide leadership for science to all elementary schools in the district by facilitating regular meetings with principals to improve curriculum and instruction, 2) provide intensive, job-embedded and on-going professional development by demonstrating and modeling high yield, research-based instructional practices to whole classes, small groups, or individuals, 3) maintain a deep understanding of current science teaching theories and practices by attending targeted, specific training and promote exemplary science instruction and support standards-based curricula in math and language arts, 4) manage and evaluate the district's elementary science program by collecting and analyzing data gathered in a multivariate capacity, 5) align district elementary science curriculum and formative evaluations with state and common core curriculum documents to better prepare students for state benchmark exams, and 6) perform other duties and projects as assigned; and

WHEREAS, the BTA presently disputes the stipended rate for said position claiming the same to fall within the parameters outlined in Article XXVI, Paragraph "A" of the Parties' Agreement attendant to the stipend position of "Coordinator"; and

WHEREAS the parties wish to resolve the dispute without the need for costly litigation.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the terms and conditions set forth herein, the parties mutually agree as follows:

- 1. The STLE Grant funded position of Elementary Science Organizer shall be paid at a stipended rate of \$5,500.00 per annum and prorated accordingly and to the extent necessary, to wit: for the period from April 24, 2014 through June 30, 2014 and thereafter from July 1, 2014 through June 30, 2015.
- 2. The STLE Grant funded position of Elementary Science Organizer shall perform those duties as herein set forth and shall not otherwise encroach upon and/or usurp the duties concomitant to and actually performed by the position of "Coordinator" and/or "Department Chairperson", as set forth in the Parties' Agreement.

- 3. Except as necessary to enforce this Agreement, the BTA hereby releases the District (including its past and current officers, employees and agents) from any and all grievances, improper practice charges, causes of action, judgments, damages and/or claims of any kind or nature arising out of or in connection with the specific facts of this grievance which arose prior to, or as of the effective date of this Agreement and hereby agrees to withdraw, with prejudice, any such outstanding claims should the same so exist.
- 4. Except as specifically set forth herein, it is agreed that the provisions of this Memorandum of Agreement shall be non-precedent setting, shall not constitute a practice or a policy on the part of the District or the BTA, and shall not be construed as modifying any of the terms of the existing Collective Bargaining Agreement, or any practices that may exist between the District and the BTA.
- 5. This Agreement shall not be utilized by the District or the BTA in any grievance, arbitration, charge or claim of any kind, except as necessary to enforce the terms of this Agreement.
- 6. This Agreement shall not constitute an acknowledgement by either the BTA or the District regarding any of the allegations/denials that constituted the positions of the respective parties.
- 7. Should any provision of this Agreement, for any reason, be declared invalid and/or unenforceable, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining provisions of this Agreement. Such remaining provisions shall remain in full force and effect as if this Agreement had been executed with the invalid provision(s) eliminated.
- 8. This Agreement and the rights and obligations of the parties hereunder shall be construed in accordance with, and governed by, the laws and regulations of the State of New York and applicable Federal laws and regulations.
- 9. This Agreement, is the complete and exclusive statement of the Agreement between the parties, and supersedes all prior or contemporaneous, oral or written: agreements, proposals, understandings, representations, conditions or covenants between the parties relating to the subject matter of the Agreement.
- 10. This Agreement, and any amendments to this Agreement, will not be in effect until it is approved by the Board of Education, pursuant to a resolution passed by a majority of its full membership, and signed by authorized representatives of both parties.
- 11. This Agreement may not be amended or modified orally; this Agreement can only be amended or modified by written agreement, signed by authorized representatives of both parties.
- 12. This Memorandum of Agreement is subject to and contingent upon approval by the Board of Education.

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT made this _____ day of December, 2014 by and between the Board of Education of the South Country Central School District (hereinafter "Board" or "District"), and the Bellport Teachers' Association (hereinafter "BTA") is constituted as follows:

WHEREAS, the District and the BTA are parties to a Collective Bargaining Agreement ("CBA") with a term of July 1, 2008 through June 30, 2015; and

WHEREAS Article VIII and Article IX of the CBA, titled, "Final Year Increment and Retirement Incentive" and "Retirement Incentive," respectively, describe certain retirement benefits for eligible employees; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education has heretofore determined that it is financially advantageous to extend the eligibility requirements of these two Articles to employees who retire the school year prior to their first year of becoming eligible to retire without penalty from the New York State Teachers Retirement System;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the terms and conditions set forth herein, the parties mutually agree as follows:

- 1. That the first paragraph of Article VIII, "Final Year Increment and Retirement Incentive," as described in the CBA shall be modified for the limited period of time described herein, such that a teacher who will reach his/her first year of eligibility to retire without penalty in the 2015/2016 school year from the New York State Teachers Retirement System and who submits his/her resignation for retirement purposes on or before December 10, 2014, to take effect following the end of the 2014/2015 school year, shall be deemed to satisfy the eligibility and procedural requirements of the first paragraph of Article VIII of the parties' Agreement.
- 2. That paragraph "B" of Article IX, "Retirement Incentive," as described in the CBA shall be modified for the limited period of time described herein, such that eligibility shall be extended to those teachers who are in the school year immediately preceding their first year of eligibility to retire without penalty from the New York State Teachers Retirement System.
- 3. That those teachers who will reach his/her first year of eligibility to retire without penalty in the 2015/2016 school year from the New York State Teachers Retirement System and who submit his/her resignation for retirement purposes on or before December 10, 2014, to take effect following the end of the 2014/2015 school year, shall be deemed to satisfy the eligibility and procedural requirements of paragraph (A)(4) of Article XXIII, "Fringe Benefit", as set forth in the CBA, such that effective with the resignation date, said teacher and the district will enter into an individual contract (see CBA, Appendix A) that will provide health insurance benefits to the retiree and his/her dependents and further, for all new retirees, the District shall agree to pay the negotiated percentage in effect at the date of resignation.
- 4. Except as specifically set forth herein, it is agreed that the provisions of this Memorandum of Agreement shall be non-precedent setting, shall not constitute a practice or a

policy on the part of the District or the BTA, and shall not be construed as modifying any of the terms of the existing Collective Bargaining Agreement, or any practices that may exist between the District and the BTA.

- That this Agreement shall automatically expire and be of no force or effect as of the close of business on December 10, 2014, except for the parties' respective obligations delineated herein.
- 6. This Agreement shall not be utilized by the District or the BTA in any grievance. arbitration, charge or claim of any kind, except as necessary to enforce the terms of this Agreement.
- 7. Should any provision of this Agreement, for any reason, be declared invalid and/or unenforceable, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining provisions of this Agreement. Such remaining provisions shall remain in full force and effect as if this Agreement had been executed with the invalid provision(s) eliminated.
- This Agreement and the rights and obligations of the parties hereunder shall be construed in accordance with, and governed by, the laws and regulations of the State of New York and applicable Federal laws and regulations.
- 9. This Agreement, is the complete and exclusive statement of the Agreement between the parties, and supersedes all prior or contemporaneous, oral or written: agreements, proposals, understandings, representations, conditions or covenants between the parties relating to the subject matter of the Agreement.
- This Agreement, and any amendments to this Agreement, will not be in effect until it is approved by the Board of Education, pursuant to a resolution passed by a majority of its full membership, and signed by authorized representatives of both parties.
- This Agreement may not be amended or modified orally; this Agreement can only be amended or modified by written agreement, signed by authorized representatives of both parties.
- 12. This Memorandum of Agreement is subject to and contingent upon approval by the Board of Education.

CONSULTANT SERVICES CONTRACT

This Agreement is entered into this 30th day of May, 2014, by and between the Board of Education of the South Country Central School District (hereinafter the "DISTRICT"), having its principal place of business for the purpose of this Agreement at 189 North Dunton Ave, East Patchogue, New York, and Dr. Clay Cook, Sound Educational and Psychological SVCS, PS, Inc. (hereinafter "CONSULTANT"), having its principal place of business for the purpose of this Agreement at 4843 46th Avenue SW, Seattle, WA 98116.

A. TERM

The term of this Agreement shall be from May 30, 2014 through June 30, 2014 inclusive, unless terminated early as provided for in this Agreement. It is understood the DISTRICT is under no obligation to renew this Agreement upon its expiration.

B. SERVICES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

1. During the term of this agreement, the services to be provided by the CONSULTANT to the DISTRICT shall include, but not limited to the following:

Staff Development/Training

2. During the term of this Agreement, the services to be provided by the CONSULTANT to the DISTRICT shall be provided according to the following schedule:

During the school day 8:00 - 4:00

- 3. CONSULTANT shall perform all services under this Agreement in accordance with all applicable Federal, State and local laws, rules, and regulations, as well as the established policy guidance from the New York State Education Department.
- 4. CONSULTANT shall provide conscientious, competent and diligent services throughout the term of the Agreement.
- 5. The DISTRICT shall have the right to examine any or all records or accounts maintained by the CONSULTANT in connection with this Agreement.
- CONSULTANT shall observe and comply with all applicable DISTRICT Policies
 and Regulations while on the grounds of the DISTRICT or providing services under
 this Agreement.
- 7. CONSULTANT shall provide all services pursuant to this Agreement in a competent, professional and timely manner.

- 8. DISTRICT reserves the right to rejectany of the CONSULTANT'S staff, which the DISTRICT, at its sole descretion, may deem unqualified.
- 9. CONSULTANT shall perform background checks and fingerprinting services to employees, and comply with all applicable provisions of the Safe Schools Against Violence in Education (SAVE) Act. CONSULTANT shall provide the DISTRICT with the appropriate proof of clearance for employment by the New York State Education Department.

C. <u>CONDITIONS</u>

In performing the services specified in this Agreement, it is understood that:

1. Independent Contractor:

- a. CONSULTANT will be engaged as an Independent Contractor, and therefore be solely responsible for the payment of federal and state income taxes applicable to this Agreement.
- b. Neither CONSULTANT nor any of its employees, agents, or assigns will be eligible for any employee benefits whatsoever relative to this contract including, but not limited to, Social Security, New York State Worker's Compensation, unemployment insurance, New York State Employee's Retirement System, health or dental insurance, or malpractice insurance, or the like.
- c. The DISTRICT, if required by Federal or State requirements, will submit a Form 1099 and IT 2102.1 respectively at year-end to the Federal Government for all individuals having a gross income exceeding \$600, which thereupon will be reported for income tax purposes.

2. Defense / Indemnification:

- a. CONSULTANT agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the DISTRICT, its officers, directors, agents, or employees against all claims, demands, actions, lawsuits, costs, damages and expenses, including attorneys' fees, judgments, fines and amounts arising from any willful act, omission, error, recklessness or negligence of the CONSULTANT, its officers, directors, agents or employees in connection with the performance of services pursuant to this Agreement. The obligations pursuant to this provision shall survive the termination of this Agreement.
- b. The DISTRICT agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the CONSULTANT, its officers, directors, agents, or employees against all claims, demands, actions, lawsuits, costs, damages and expenses, including attorneys' fees, judgments, fines and amounts arising from any willful act,

omission, error, recklessness or negligence of the DISTRICT, its officers, directors, agents or employees in connection with the performance of services pursuant to this Agreement. The obligations pursuant to this provision shall survive the termination of this Agreement.

- 3. It is expressly understood that this Agreement shall not be assigned or transferred without prior written consent of the other party.
- 4. The failure of either party to enforce any provision of this Agreement shall not be construed as a waiver or limitation of that party's right to subsequently enforce every provision of this Agreement.
- 5. Should any provision of this Agreement, for any reason, be declared invalid and/or unenforceable, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining provisions of this Agreement. Such remaining provisions shall remain in full force and effect as if this Agreement had been executed with the invalid provision(s) eliminated.
- 6. This Agreement and the rights and obligations of the parties hereunder shall be construed in accordance with, and governed by, the laws and regulations of the State of New York and applicable Federal laws and regulations. Any dispute arising under this Agreement shall be litigated in the Courts of Nassau County, New York.
- 7. This Agreement, is the complete and exclusive statement of the Agreement between the parties, and supersedes all prior or contemporaneous, oral or written: agreements, proposals, understandings, representations, conditions or covenants between the parties relating to the subject matter of the Agreement.
- 8. This Agreement may not be changed orally, but only by an Agreement, in writing, signed by authorized representatives of both parties.
- 9. This Agreement, and any amendments to this Agreement, will not be in effect until agreed to in writing and signed by authorized representatives of both parties.

D. <u>COMPENSATION</u>

- 1. Compensation shall be three thousand (\$3,000.00) dollars for a total of 2 days of direct services which is inclusive of all the activities performed to construct summary reports for the universal screening data. This sum also includes phone consultation prior to and after the dates of submitting the reports.
- 2. The CONSULTANT shall submit invoices for payment when all of the work is completed. The DISTRICT shall pay CONSULTANT within thirty (30) days of the DISTRICT'S receipt of a detailed written invoice from the CONSULTANT. Said invoice shall include the services provided, the total hours, the dates that the invoice covers, and the total amount due for the period specified.

- 3. The DISTRICT shall give the CONSULTANT notice of any invoice disputes within twenty (20) days of its receipt of the invoice, and reserves the right to withhold payment pending the resolution of the dispute.
- Neither CONSULTANT nor any of its personnel shall share or accept any fee or gratuity for services provided pursuant to this Agreement except as expressly set forth in this Agreement.
- 5. CONSULTANT shall bear the cost of all expenses incurred as the result of doing business, including, but not limited to all fees, fines, licenses, bonds or taxes as well as the cost of all tools, vehicles or other equipment necessary for the implementation of services pursuant to this agreement.

E. TERMINATION

- 1. The CONSULTANT'S services shall be at the will of the Board of Education of the DISTRICT. The DISTRICT may terminate the appointment at any time prior to the end of the term without notice and with or without cause.
- 2. In the event the CONSULTANT or the DISTRICT terminates this Agreement with or without cause, such termination of the Agreement shall not discharge the parties' existing obligations to each other as of the effective date of termination.
- 3. Neither CONSULTANT nor any of its personnel shall share or accept any fee or gratuity for services provided pursuant to this Agreement except as expressly set forth in this Agreement.

F. INSURANCE

- 1. CONSULTANT, at its sole expense, shall procure and maintain such policies of commercial general liability, malpractice and other insurance as shall be necessary to insure the CONSULTANT and the DISTRICT, including the Board of Education, employees and volunteers, as additional insured, against any claim for liability, personal injury, or death occasioned directly or indirectly by CONSULTANT in connection with the performance of CONSULTANT'S responsibilities under this Agreement; each such policy shall provide a minimum coverage of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000).
- 2. The insurance is to be underwritten by a licensed and/or admitted New York State Insurer with a minimum Bests rating of A-minus.

- 3. In the event any of the aforementioned insurance policies are cancelled or not renewed, the CONSULTANT shall notify the District in writing within thirty (30) days of such cancellation or non-renewal.
- 4. Upon the execution of this Agreement, CONSULTANT will supply the DISTRICT with a Certificate of Insurance including the DISTRICT, Board of Education, employees and volunteers as Additional Insured, a copy of the Declaration pages of the policies, and a copy of the additional insured endorsement.
