from her position. When I received my copy of the decision of the Impartial Hearing Officer, I combed through it to see what it contained that would affect how I would vote this evening. I put great weight to the section that cited on what the Commissioner of Education based his decision. I also reviewed our district's policies. The policies were clear as were the Commissioner's previous decisions. That being said, the decision I must make will be based upon my duties as a Trustee and my accountability to the children of the South Country community.

Mrs. McKenna also mentioned the dollar amount expended on the Board of Education vs. Mrs. Huffine; said this amount could pay for a teacher's salary; `also spoke about the purpose of Board policies and says she wonders who else has breached these policies.

- After the vote had been taken, with the resolution being adopted, Mrs. Huffine asked to speak. She said that the Board has repeatedly failed to comply with Education Law, and has generated countless legal fees because of its inappropriate actions; that there are may instances of inappropriate actions that left the district open to countless legal fees; in addition, Mrs. Huffine said that the this Board failed to find actions that constitute official misconduct.
